(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 14th day of November, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Waltham Abbey, in the parish of Waltham Holy Cross, in the Epping Division of the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, starting from the junction of Sewardstone-street with Little Sewardstone-street and proceeding west along the south side of Little Sewardstone-street to the west side of Black Boy-alley, thence south along the west side of Black Boy-alley to the north side of Town Mead-lane, thence east along the north side of Town Mead-lane to the west side of Sewardstone-street, and thence north along the west side of Sewardstone-street to the point of starting,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the seventeenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

1. The following Area (namely),—the borough

of Dudley,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Llanidabo, in the county of Hereford, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing from the Axe and Cleaver public-house down the lane leading to Bigglestone farmhouse, including the whole of the homestead and buildings, thence by a straight line to New Mills, thence by the brook to a point where the same crosses the road at Hoarwithy, thence by the road leading from Hoarwithy by Redbrook Farm and Harewood Farm to the main road at Harewood End, and thence by the main road to the Axe and Cleaver public-house aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
