THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 19 of The Rabies Order of 1887, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Middlesex, to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcase of a certain dog buried during the month of October last in a field near the London and North-Western Railway at Willesden, in the county of Middlesex, subject to the following conditions:—

1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause the carcase to be examined with a view to ascertain whether the dog was affected with true rabies, and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcase to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause it to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant.

The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, examination, and re-burial of the carcase shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.

THE Board of Trade have received through ville Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of Despatch, dated 30th ultimo, from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, enclosing the following translation of an Ordinance respecting Italian sanitary restrictions against goods from Turkey:—

1888.—Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 13.

THE Minister of the Interior, in compliance with the Law of 20th March, 1865, Appendix C, respecting the public health, and with the Ministerial Instructions of 20th December, 1871, decrees:—

1. That from the 1st of December next the prohibition imposed by the Ordinance No. 6, of 6th April last, against the importation of untanned hides, wool, horns, hoofs, and other products of horned cattle and sheep, is removed so far as concerns all the States forming European Turkey. The said prohibition shall remain in force in regard to the States forming part of Asiatic Turkey.

2. From the date above mentioned, the said goods, being the produce of European Turkey, shall be freely admitted into Italy, provided they are accompanied by a certificate of origin to be issued by the Local Authorities, and certified by the Consular Agents of Italy who reside or have jurisdiction in the places where the goods are shipped.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch, dated 23rd ultimo, from Her Majesty's Consul at Teneriffe, enclosing the following translation of a Notice received from the Civil Governor of that Island respecting quarantine there:—

The Director-General de Beneficencia y Sanidad, in reply to a telegram I addressed to him yesterday, telegraphs to me as follows:—

"I agree with you in your opinion respecting application of Article 53 of Royal Order of 31st March. With regard to the islands only infected ports are understood, and in this sense orders will be circulated."

"Which I hasten to communicate to you for your guidance, and have the pleasure to acquaint you in continuation of the first telegram, that as hitherto all British vessels arriving at this port

and the other five islands, with the exception of Santa Cruz de la Palma, will be cleared without endorsement on their bills of health, which may prejudice them at port of destination.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the several Boroughs in England and Wales, other than County Boroughs;—

WHEREAS the Local Government Act."
1888, after enacting that a County Council shall;
be established in every Administrative County,
makes provision for the Election of County
Councillors in each such county, and for the
conduct of such elections;

And whereas by Section 75 of the said Act certain portions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, are, for the purpose of carrying the said Local Government Act into effect, made applicable, subject as in the said Section mentioned; and by sub-section (6) provision is made as to Returning Officers in Flectoral Divisions of a County which are co-extensive with or are wholly comprised in Boroughs;

And whereas a difficulty has arisen as to the person who is authorized to act as Returning Officer in any Electoral Division which is either co-extensive with a Borough divided into Wards, or is comprised in any such Borough and is not co-extensive with a Ward;

And whereas by Section 108 of the said Act, in the case of any difficulty arising as respects the holding of the First Election of County Councillors, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to do, by Order, any matter or thing which appears to Us necessary for the proper holding of such Election, and it is enacted that any such Order may modify the provisions of the said Act, and the enactments applied by the said Act, so far as may appear to Us necessary for the purpose aforesaid:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—For the purposes of the First Election of any County Councillor in any Electoral Division which is either co-extensive with a Borough divided into Wards, or is comprised in any such Borough and is not co-extensive with a Ward, the person who shall act as Returning Officer under sub-section (6) of Section 75 of the Local Government Act, 1888, shall be the person who would act as Returning Officer under the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, if the Election of such County Councillor were a First Election of a Town Councillor for a Ward held after the division of the Borough into Wards, and the Electoral Division were a Ward.

ARTICLE II. The Writ to be directed by the County Returning Officer to the Returning Officer for such an Electoral Division shall be sufficient if directed to the Mayor by name, although some other person may have been appointed to act as Returning Officer; and in such case the Mayor shall cause the Writ to be delivered to the person so appointed.

ARTICLE III. Expressions in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the Local Government Act, 1888.
