

- (a.) Cattle in or into or out of a Cattle-Plague Infected Place ; or
 (b.) Cattle in or into or out of a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place or Area ; or
 (c.) Cattle in or into or out of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or Area ; or
 (d.) Cattle affected with pleuro-pneumonia ; or
 (e.) Cattle in or into or out of a Foreign Animals Wharf or a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station or a Landing-Place for foreign animals.

Exception of Railways from Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle.

8. Where a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Circle has been constituted under this Order, there shall be deemed to be excepted from that Circle the lines of railway within that Circle, so far as those lines are used or required for the transit of cattle through that Circle, without untrucking, and nothing in this Order respecting movement of cattle in or into or out of such Circle shall be deemed to interfere with that transit.

Production of Licences ; Names and Addresses.

9.—(1.) Every person in charge of cattle being moved, where, under this Order, a movement licence may be necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a Constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the movement licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or Constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a head of cattle is moved in contravention of this Order, or of any licence thereunder, the owner of the head of cattle and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) If a person in charge of a head of cattle being moved, where under this Order a movement licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Notice, dated 14th ultimo, framed by the Board of Health of Escambia County, Florida, the following being an Extract :—

1st. That between the 15th of November, 1888, and the 15th of May, 1889, no vessel from Rio or Havana, or any other point infected with yellow fever, or having on board any contagious or infectious disease, or on which such disease may have existed within thirty days, shall be permitted to discharge cargo or ballast within the Harbour of Pensacola, except at the quarantine station in Santa Rosa Sound: Provided that if the port physician or inspector shall report that such cargo or ballast may, without prejudice or danger to the public health, be discharged at any other point, and the President of this Board shall endorse and approve such report, then such cargo or ballast may be discharged at any point in the said harbour in such manner as the President of this Board shall direct.

4th. That no vessel coming into the Port of Pensacola in ballast between the above mentioned dates shall discharge the same, except at quarantine station, if the port inspector shall report that her ballast is of a character to endanger the public health.
