Briqueras, about a League and a buf from Pignerol, August 10.

N the 7th of this Month the Regiment of French Protestants, commanded by the Sieur de Loche, arrived at Barges, without any disturbance from the Enemy, though we passed very ness them. The 8th, we marched to Bebiano, (meeting in our way with the Marquis de la Parele, Lieutenant General of the Duke of Slavoy's Army, who was lent to Bebiano to give forme Orders about the Militin, after which he returned to the Duke's Camp) and having fecured the most considerable Posts round that place, we advanced to a Hill within a quarter of a League of Lucerne, where we found Monfieur Arnaud with a Guard of about 30 Men of the Militia. Colones de Loche having observed the several Posts the Enemy were pollessed of in and about Lucerne, he detached 200 Men to joyn the Chevalier Vercelli, who; by order of the Duke of Savor, had put himfelf at the Head of Monfieur Arnaud's Troop. This Detachement passed within Musquet Shot of Lucerne, and having joyned the Vaudin that were posted behind Roura, and the 200 Men commanded by the Chevalier Verceli, they marched towards the Fort which the French had built on a Hill not far from Lucerne, and attack'd it about an hour before Sun-fet. The French, who had received a strong Reinforcement from Lucerne, made a good refittance for some time, but at last, not being able to withstand the close and vigorous Assaults our Men made upon them, they fled out of the Fort, and we purfued them to the Walls of Lucerne. In the mean time Colonel de Loche had allarm'd the Enemy on the other fide, and understanding that they were in a great consternation at Lucerne, he sent notice thereof to the Marquis de la Parelle, and of his defign to attack them. The next day the Marquis came himself with some Troops of the Militia, and marched towards Lucerne, being followed by the Sieur de Loche's Regiment, but before our arrival there the Enemy were marched out, and had already passed the wooden Bridge, and let file to several Houses near the Vineyards. Some of the Militia of Mondovi, that came with the Mar-quis de la Parece, fell upon the Enemies Rear, but advancing too far, were repulfed by their Horse and Dragoons. This did not discourage us from purfaing them, and being all joyned together, we attack'd them on the other fide of the burnt Houses, The Enemies Horle made several stands to cover the Retreat of their Foot, but our Men, though they were very much fatigued, beat them from place to place, and puffued them to Briqueras, and forced folution to fight them, having for that reason fint

them to abandon an old Castle fortified with The Colonel caused the Town Palissadoes. to be attack'd in three places, which we entred, and made our felves Mafters or it, and took divers Prifoners, who had intrench'd themselves in the Church, and two Colours. All our Men behaved themselves extremely well in these several Actions; and had we had some Horse with us, in all probability there would very few of the Enemy have escaped, though they very much exceeded us in number; for they had at Licerne 3000 Foot, and 4 Squadrons of Horse, and 6 more went from Brigheras to meet them, and we, belides our fick Men and the Guards we left at 82biano and Lucerne, had not above 1000. We had 5 Officers, Vaudon and French, and about 50 Soldiers, killed. The Enemy loft above 140c, the Ground in all the places where they made a frand being covered with dead Bodies; Thote that escaped fled to Pignerol, and to their Camp. We are now Masters of the Valleys, by which means we shall be able to hinder any Succors from coming to Monsieur Catinat from Danphine, and hope to be shortly strong enough to make further progresses on that side. By two Prisoners that are escaped from Pignerol, we are assured, that the Hospitals there are full of sick and wounded Men, and that the French have loft in the Actions above related 2 Colonels, 3 Lieutenant-Colonels, and many other Officers.

Venice, August 25. It is confirmed by all the advices from the Levane, that the Turkith Fleet, commanded by the Captain-Buffa Mezzomorte, was at Sea with a defign to relieve Napoli di Maia afia. But the Letters of the 10 instant from Corfu Lay, that the Forces of the Republick continued to keep that place very closely block'd up, as well by Land as Sea. The new Proveditore-General of the Morea Signior Antonio Zen parted from hence the last week with divers Veffels laden with Ammunition and Provisions, and new-raised Troops, for the Levant. We have an account from Maira, of the death of Don Gregoria Caraffa, Great Matter of that Order, and that they had chosen Alarame de Vignacourt, who was before Great Treasurer of Maita, to succeed

Cologne, September 5. The Letters from the Palatinate give an account, that the Electors of Saxony and Bavaria being joyned together, they matched with the Forces under their command towards Durlach, and from thence advanced on the 28th of the last Month to Et ingen, within 5 German miles of Rastat, near which place the French Army, under the command of the Dauphin, lay very advantageously encamped. That they rested there the 29th, and intended to continue their march the next day towards the Enemy, with a re-
