In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 26th instant, enclosing the following translation of an Argentine notice relative to quarantine:—

Buenos Aires,

February 8, 1889.

In view of the antecedent note from the National Health Department in which is made apparent the serious risk accruing to public health from the frequent traffic carried on by vessels trading between Paraguayan ports and those situated in the northern part of Brazil, and the ports of the Empire last-mentioned which are declared to be infected or suspicious, in accordance with the Articles of the International Sanitary Convention officially put in force; and considering—

sidering—
1st. That, up to the present date, the Republic of Paraguay has adopted no precautionary measures whatsoever against a possible invasion of epidemic, when the increase, day by day of yellow fever at Rio de Janeiro is borne in mind.

2nd. That, in order to provide that vessels proceeding from Paraguay or from ports in the northern portion of Brazil shall not touch at internal Argentine ports without having previously conformed to sanitary usages, the establishment of a Maritime Sanitary Station at the mouths of the rivers in Argentine territory is indispensable.

3rd. That, in order that vessels proceeding from Paraguay or from ports in the northern part of Brazil shall not touch at internal Argentine ports without having previously carried sanitary measures into practical effect, it is indispensable to establish a Maritime Sanitary Station at the entrance of rivers in Argentine territory.

4th. That it is a duty incumbent on the National Government to preserve public health from the inroad of exotic pestilential diseases by every means within i's power.

The Vice-President of the Argentine Republic, in exercise of the executive authority, decrees:

ART. I. The ports of the Republic of Paraguay and of Northern Brazil are declared suspicious, to the intent that vessels originally proceeding from, or having touched at, the said ports may be amenable to sanitary processes in accordance with the prescriptions laid down in the International Convention.

ART. II. The National Health Department is authorized to establish a sanitary station on the most convenient spot at the entrance of the Rivers Paraquay and Parana in Argentine territory in order that, on that spot, the sanitary visit may take effect and the requisite precautions may be there adopted.

ART. III. Vessels proceeding from Rio de Janeiro and other ports in the southern portion of the Brazilian Empire, and desiring to ascend the rivers, shall request the Health Visit on their arrival in the roadstead of Buenos Aires, and shall be subject to such measures as may be adopted for other vessels arriving from the same points, and in accordance with their sanitary condition on board.

ART. IV. Vessels proceeding from Paraguay and ports in the northern portion of the Empire of Brazil, shall request the Health Visit at the station referred to in Article II of the present Decree, until this ("esto")? station be definitively installed in the port of the city of Corrientes.

ART. V. The Ministry of Marine has been instructed to make arrangements for stationing two ships of war at the points best adapted for carrying into effect the stipulations of the present

Decree.

ART. VI. The National Health Department is authorized to incur such outlay as may be required for the installation and maintenance of the Sanitary Station.

ORDER OF SECRETARY OF STATE, No. 3 (a). EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vict. c. 17).

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Explosives Act, 1875 (in this Order referred to as the Act), an Order of the Secretary of State (known as Order of Secretary of State, No. 3) was made on the 27th day of November, 1875, adapting the General Rules relating to packing of gunpowder, contained in Part I of the Act to the packing of explosives other than gunpowder; and whereas by section 83 of the Act, it is provided that a Secretary of State may by order from time to time revoke, add to, or alter any previous orders of the Secretary of State.

Now, therefore, in the exercise of the powers aforesaid, I, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby order as follows:—

Secretaries of State, hereby order as follows:—
1. Part B, Rule 2 of the Order of the Secretary of State, No. 3 aforesaid, relating to the packing of explosives of the 1st division of the 3rd (nitro compound) class, shall be amended as follows:—

(a.) By the insertion after the words "shall not contain more than 10 lbs.," in the said Rule, of the words "except with the consent of and under conditions approved by a Government inspector"; and

(b.) By the insertion after the words "thoroughly waterproof" in the said Rule, of the words "except with the consent of and under conditions approved by a Government Inspector."

2. Part E, Rule 3, of the Order of Secretary

2. Part E, Rule 3, of the Order of Secretary of State, No. 3 aforesaid, relating to the Packing of Explosive of the 3rd division of the 6th (ammunition) class, shall be amended by the insertion after the words "shall not contain more than 2 lbs. of such explosive," in the said Rule, of the words "except with the consent of and under conditions approved by a Government inspector."

3. There shall be appended to Part E, Rule 3

aforesaid, the following proviso:-

Provided that in the case of detonators, the following General Rules shall be observed in addition to all other general rules relating to the packing for conveyance of explosive of the 3rd division of the 6th (ammunition) class.

- (a) The detonators and the spaces between the same, and between the sides of the inner package and the said detonators shall all be filled, as far as practicable, with fine sawdust or other similar material; a layer of cotton wool or other soft elastic material shall be placed between both ends of all the detonators and the interior of the inner package in which the same are placed, in such manner and so secured that both ends of the detonators will rest upon the said cotton wool or other material; every inner package, if of metal, to be lined throughout with paper or other soft material, and
- (b.) When the number of such detonators packed for conveyance exceeds in all one thousand (1,000), or such greater number as may from time to time be assigned with the consent of and under conditions approved by a Government Inspector, all the inner packages as aforesaid shall be placed inside a substantial case of wood or metal, made and closed so as to prevent any of the inner packages escaping therefrom, and such case shall be placed inside such outer package as

is required by the above general rules relating to the packing for conveyance of explosives of the 3rd division of the 6th (ammunition) class, in such manner and so secured as to leave a clear space of not less than three inches between every part of the interior of the said outer package, notwithstanding that such clear space may, if preferred,

be filled with sawdust, straw, or other similar material, or may contain a light framework or battens of wood to keep the case aforesaid in position in the outer package.

TREASURY WARRANT

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Repeal.

1. There shall be repealed, revoked, and annulled on and as from the day on which this Warrant comes into operation, so much of the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the twenty-sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, as relates to the transmission of Parcels by way of the United Kingdom between the places mentioned in the second part of the First Schedule thereto, and the whole of the Warrant of the said Commissioners, dated the twenty-fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eightyseven, relating to the transmission of Parcels by way of the United Kingdom between British Colonies and France, and certain other countries therein mentioned.

Definitions.

2. In this Warrant the expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

3. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by

post by way of the United Kingdom between the Cape of Good Hope and the countries mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

Rates of Postage.

4. On all Parcels transmitted by post under this Warrant from the Cape of Good Hope to any country mentioned in the Schedule hereto there shall be charged and paid the several rates of postage specified in such Schedule.

Maximum Weight.

- 5. There shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post under this Warrant any Parcel exceeding seven pounds in weight, except in the case of Parcels posted in or addressed to Belgium, Luxemburg, the Netherlands, or Norway, which shall not exceed eleven pounds in weight.
- Mode of Posting.
