

shall be subject to such measures as may be adopted for other vessels arriving from the same points, and in accordance with their sanitary condition on board.

ART. IV. Vessels proceeding from Paraguay and ports in the northern portion of the Empire of Brazil, shall request the Health Visit at the station referred to in Article II of the present Decree, until this ("esto") ? station be definitively installed in the port of the city of Corrientes.

ART. V. The Ministry of Marine has been instructed to make arrangements for stationing two ships of war at the points best adapted for carrying into effect the stipulations of the present Decree.

ART. VI. The National Health Department is authorized to incur such outlay as may be required for the installation and maintenance of the Sanitary Station.
