HER Majesty the Queen has been pleased to direct, on the present melancholy occasion of the death of Her Royal Highness The Duchess of Cambridge, Aunt to Her Majesty, that the Officers of the Army be required to wear, when

in uniform, a band of black crape round the left arm, as prescribed by the regulations.

The Mourning will continue to be worn until the 28th instant.

ORDERS for the Mourning of Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines for Her late Royal Highness The Duchess of Cambridge.
