In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her inten-tion to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing except in accordance with the above Room,

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present

themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

No. 58. - Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to give the following directions:— "Sfratto" is to be enforced with respect to

"Sfratto" is to be enforced with respect to vessels coming from Rio Janeiro or other ports, when cases of yellow fever have taken place on hoard.

Vessels will be allowed to coal, in strict quarantine, on condition that they leave afterwards with

the least possible delay.

Vessels coming from ports known to be infected with yellow fever are to be subjected to fourteen days quarantine and to be disinfected unless they have been disinfected at an intermediate port.
