In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be

submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card

with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

**MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACTS,
1882 AND 1885.**

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the existing Local Authorities of the Local Government District of Loughborough (now the borough of Loughborough) and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882.

"WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized:

"And whereas certain inhabitant householders from the Local Government District of Loughborough, in the county of Leicester, petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation:

"And whereas the said petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter:

"And whereas by Charter dated the 7th day of September 1888 a district consisting of parts of the townships of Loughborough and Knight Thorpe and parts of the parish of Dishley-with-Thorpe Acre was created a Municipal Borough by the name of the borough of Loughborough and the said Charter extended the Municipal Corporations Acts to the said borough of Loughborough:

"And whereas, under and by virtue of the Public Health Act, 1848, and the various Acts amending the same, the Local Board of Health for the district of Loughborough (hereinafter called the 'Local Board') was constituted and became invested with various powers and duties, and the same was before the creation of the said borough the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Local Government District of Loughborough:

"And whereas the said Local Government District of Loughborough consists of the townships of Loughborough Knight Thorpe and Woodthorpe and is coterminous with the parish of Loughborough:

"And whereas by the Loughborough Local Board Act, 1868, and the Loughborough Local Board Act, 1886 (in this Scheme referred to respectively as 'the Act of 1868' and 'the Act of 1886' or together as 'the Acts of 1868 and 1886'), the Local Board were empowered to construct and maintain waterworks, and to supply water within the limits defined in the said Acts, and they have accordingly constructed waterworks and have thereunder supplied water within their water limits:

"And whereas by the Act of 1868 the Local Board were empowered to purchase certain market rights, and to hold and regulate markets and fairs within their district, to levy tolls, and to provide better and more extensive accommodation for market and fair purposes, and the powers of the Local Board were in other respects enlarged:

"And whereas it is expedient that provision be made for the continuance, transfer, and vesting and extension of the water undertaking of the Local Board and other the property, rights, powers and privileges conferred by or acquired under the Act of 1868 and the Act of 1886, as by this Scheme mentioned:

"And whereas under and by virtue of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, and the various Acts amending the same, a School Board was formed for the School District of the township of Loughborough (hereinafter called the Loughborough Township School Board and District respectively), and a School Board was formed for the United School District of Thorpe Acre, comprising the parishes of Dishley-cum-Thorpe Acre and Garendon, and the township of Knight Thorpe (hereinafter called the United School Board and District respectively):

"And whereas the area of the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, contains a part of the district of the Loughborough Township School Board and a part of the district of the Thorpe Acre United School Board, and it is expedient that in this Scheme certain provisions should be made with respect to the said Boards:

"And whereas the Local Board and the said School Boards are Local Authorities within the meaning of the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885:

"And whereas this Scheme was before being settled by the Committee of Council referred to the consideration of the Committee of the Lords of the Privy Council on Education (hereinafter referred to as the Education Department):

"And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth:

"Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the said Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

"1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Loughborough Scheme, 1888.

"2. This Scheme shall be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter, and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting and everything thereunder shall be done and

had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as the commencement of this Scheme.

"3. The Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall be placed immediately on, from, and after the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough aforesaid and thenceforward within the jurisdiction of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Loughborough, acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough.

"4. The Local Board, its powers, duties, obligations and privileges shall continue, and shall be deemed to have continued until the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the creation of the said borough, and immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the Local Board shall be, and the same is hereby, abolished and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist.

"5. The water undertaking of the Local Board, and every power, right, duty, capacity, liability, obligation, or property exercisable by, attaching to, or vested in the Local Board under the Acts of 1868 and 1886, shall pass to, be exercisable by, attach to, and vest in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Loughborough, acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

"6. Every reference in the Acts of 1868 and 1886 or the said Acts as altered by any general or local Act before the commencement of this Scheme to the Local Board shall be deemed and construed to be a reference to the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Loughborough acting by the Council and every reference or incorporation by the said Acts or the said Acts as altered by any general or local Act of Parliament before the commencement of this Scheme to or of any provisions of the Public Health Act 1875 or the Acts amending or enlarging the same applicable in the case of a Local Board shall be deemed and construed to be a reference or incorporation to or of the corresponding provisions of the said Public Health Act 1875 and other Acts applicable in the case of a Municipal Borough.

"7. The whole of the borough of Loughborough shall be deemed to be within the limits of the Acts of 1868 and 1886 and the Acts of 1868 and 1886 as amended or altered by this Scheme shall apply and extend accordingly not only to the parts heretofore within the limits of the said Acts but also to the whole of the said borough.

"8. All rights, property, liabilities, or obligations vested in or attached to the Local Board under the Public Health Act 1875 or any Act amending or enlarging the same with respect to or for the purposes of so much of the Local Government District of Loughborough as is included within the borough of Loughborough and all such rights property liabilities or obligations vested in or attached to the Local Board as are not transferred under Clause 10 hereof shall pass to be exercisable by or against, vest in or attach to the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the said borough acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough.

"9. Those parts of the Local Government District of Loughborough which are not included within the limits of the said Municipal Borough shall for all the purposes of the Public Health Act 1875, and any Act amending or enlarging the same or incorporated therewith be within, and be part of the district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Loughborough Union and be

within and subject to the jurisdiction of the said Sanitary Authority and all the powers rights privileges franchises duties and obligations of the said Sanitary Authority shall apply to and be exercisable in the same as being part of the district of the said Sanitary Authority.

"10. All rights property liabilities or obligations vested in or attached to the Local Board under the Public Health Act 1875 or any Act amending or enlarging the same solely with respect to or for the purposes of so much of the Local Government District of Loughborough as is not included within the said borough shall pass to be exercisable by or against vest in or attach to the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Loughborough Union.

"11. In the event of any question arising as to the meaning and effect of Clauses 8 and 10 of this Scheme such question shall be submitted to the Local Government Board and their decision stated by them in writing and under their seal shall be final and conclusive for all purposes whatever.

"12. Section 4 of the Act of 1886 shall be read and have effect as if such parts of the Local Government District of Loughborough as are not included within the said borough were an 'added area' within the meaning of that section and the said section shall apply accordingly to and with respect to the said parts of the said district which are not included within the said borough.

"13. The Loughborough Township School Board shall be the School Board for the United School District consisting of the borough of Loughborough and so much of the township of Loughborough as is outside the said borough by the name of the Loughborough United District School Board in all respects to the same extent and in the same manner as if at the time of the formation of the Loughborough Township School Board by the Education Department, the borough of Loughborough was a municipal borough, and as if the said United District had been formed by uniting the said borough and the said portion of the said township not included in the said borough, and the Loughborough United District School Board had been formed and created for a United School District formed and created as last aforesaid by the name of the Loughborough United District School Board the local rate and the rating authority shall be in each of the constituent districts the same as if such constituent districts had been originally constituted a United School District as aforesaid. Everything in connection with the said Board and United School District shall be done had and construed accordingly.

"14. All liabilities and assets attaching to and vested in the Loughborough Township School Board immediately before the commencement of this scheme shall be and continue attached to and vested in the Loughborough United District School Board, and all charges charged on the school fund and poor rate of the said township of Loughborough immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall respectively be charges upon the school fund of the Loughborough United District School Board and upon the borough rate or fund of the said borough and the poor rate of the said outside portion of the township of Loughborough and not otherwise.

"15. Any Bye-laws made by the Loughborough Township School Board, under the Acts relating to public elementary education and in force at the date of this Scheme shall continue in force and apply to the Loughborough United School District.

"16. Any act or omission done or made by the

Education Department or the said Loughborough Township School Board or the Council of the said borough or any Justice since the grant of the Charter shall be deemed to have been lawfully done or made if the said Department, School Board, Council or Justice might have lawfully done or made the same if no Charter had been granted or the said School Board had been the School Board for the said borough or township or United District.

" 17. The parts of the township of Knight Thorpe and parish of Dishley-cum-Thorpe Acre which are under the said Charter included in the borough of Loughborough shall for all purposes be within the United School District and jurisdiction and authority of the said Loughborough United District School Board and shall no longer be for any purpose within the United School District or jurisdiction or authority of the Thorpe Acre United District School Board.

" 18. The Thorpe Acre United District School Board shall be and continue the School Board for the United School District exclusive of the parts of the township of Knight Thorpe and parish of Dishley-cum-Thorpe Acre included in the said borough in all respects to the same extent and in the same manner as if at the time of the formation of the United School Board and United School District the same had been formed for the United School District exclusive of the parts of the said township and parish included in the said borough and as if only such parts of the said township and parish as are not included within the area of the said borough had been included within the United School District; and everything in connection with the said United School Board and United School District shall be done had and construed accordingly. All Bye-laws made by the United School Board under the Acts relating to elementary education and in force at the date of this Scheme shall continue in force. All acts and omissions of the Education Department or the United School Board or any Justice since the grant of the Charter shall be deemed to have been lawfully done or made if they might have been lawfully done or made if no Charter had been granted or the United School District had comprised or had not comprised the parts of the said township and parish or of either of them included within the said borough.

" 19. In case any officer of the Local Board, who shall have been employed by the Local Board for a period of five years, shall not be employed by the Council of the said borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character, and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid, by way of compensation for the loss of his position, out of the funds of or under the control of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Loughborough, acting by the Council as the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Municipal Borough, such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury or any two or more of them to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position, and the said Commissioners in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1859, to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office. Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act stating any special grounds for granting such

allowance shall be necessary or be made. Provided nevertheless, that if any such officer be so employed by the said Council and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct), within two years of the 1st day of November, 1888, he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council. Provided that the term 'Officer' shall include only persons employed by the Local Board whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons. Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the sole judges as to the right title or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever and as to the amount thereof, and the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause, and further every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right title claim amount or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause as the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners or any two or more of them may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them.

20. No act or omission done or made or purporting to be done or made under the said Acts of 1868 and 1886 between the commencement of this Scheme and the confirmation thereof by Parliament or Order in Council (as the case may be) shall be invalidated by this Scheme, but such act or omission shall be and continue valid if the same would have been valid but for the retrospective operation of this Scheme.

21. The accounts of the Local Board shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the proper officers of the Local Government Board in like manner and subject to the like powers duties provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted; the provisions of section 247 of the Public Health Act 1875 as amended by the District Auditors Act 1879 and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards and of their Officers shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the Local Board shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time extent character and operation to the purposes of such audit.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Penrith Union (among others), the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Rules and Regulations with regard to the government of the Workhouse or Workhouses of the said Union;

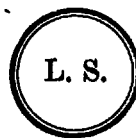
And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that, from and after the date hereof, the following regulations shall be in force in the said Penrith Union, namely,—

ARTICLE I.—Tobacco or snuff may be allowed to such of the inmates of any Workhouse of the Union who are not able-bodied, or are employed upon work of a specially disagreeable character, as the Guardians may consider should be supplied with the same, the quantity to be allowed in each case, or in any class of cases, to be such as the Guardians may by resolution prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—So much of Article 121 of the said General Order as provides that no pauper shall smoke in any room in the workhouse without the special direction of the Medical Officer shall be rescinded, as regards the said Union; but the Guardians may from time to time, by resolution, determine in what rooms and at what times smoking shall be allowed, and no pauper shall smoke in the Workhouse in any other room or at any other time than is so allowed.
