Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 17th day of May, 1889.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—at Corstorphine, in the county of Edinburgh, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by Gyle Muir-road, on the east by Meadow Place-road, on the south by the road leading from the back of Corstorphine to South Gyle Farm, and on the west by fields of South Gyle and Corstorphine Bank Farms; the said roads not being included in the Area,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. The following Area (namely),—at Corstorphine, in the county of Edinburgh, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by Gyle Muir-road, on the east by a wall separating Andrew Brooks's premises from those of Thomas Dick, on the south by a wall separating premises of Andrew Brooks, I. Scott, and Robert Meikle from fields of South Gyle and Corstorphine Bank Farms, and on the west by a wall separating Robert Meikle's premises from those of William Lees,—shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Thomas John Wynn, Mabel Wynn, and Dorothy Beatrix Wynn, minors, the brother and sisters of the said William Charles, now Baron Newborough, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as the younger children of a Baron, to which honour they would have been entitled if their father had survived his father, the said Spencer Bulkeley, late Baron Newborough, and thereby succeeded to the dignity of Baron Newborough:

And Her Majesty has been further pleased to command that the said Royal order and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by sec. 44 of the Burials Act, 1852, as extended and applied by section 7 of the Burials Act, 1853, I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby make the following regulations with respect to interments in the Paddington Cemetery, Willesden-lane, N.W.

I. The burial-ground shall be effectually fenced, and, if necessary, under-drained to such a depth as will prevent water remaining in any grave or vault.

II. The area to be used for graves shall be divided in grave-spaces, to be designated by convenient marks, so that the position of each may be readily determined, and a corresponding plan kept on which each grave-space shall be shown.

III. No earthen grave shall be dug within one foot of any other grave.

IV. A register of graves shall be kept, in which the name, age, and date of burial in each shall be duly registered.

V. No body shall be buried in any vault or walled grave unless the coffin be separately entombed in an air-tight manner, that is, by properly cemented stone or brickwork which shall never be disturbed.

VI. One body only shall be buried in any common earthen grave on the same day, unless the bodies be those of members of the same family, and that every coffin be forthwith covered with earth at least a foot thick, which shall be closely rammed down, never to be again disturbed.

VII. No unvalled family grave shall be reopened within fourteen years after the burial of a person above twelve years of age, or within eight years after the burial of a child under twelve years, unless to bury another member of the same

family; in every case a layer of earth not less than one foot thick shall be left undisturbed above the previously buried coffin; but if, on re-opening any grave, the soil be found to be offensive, such soil shall not be disturbed, and in no case shall human remains be removed from the grave.

VII. No coffin shall be buried in any unvalled grave within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall not be less than three feet below that level.

And the Burial Board of the parish of Paddington is hereby required to conform to and obey the said Regulations as provided by the Act.
