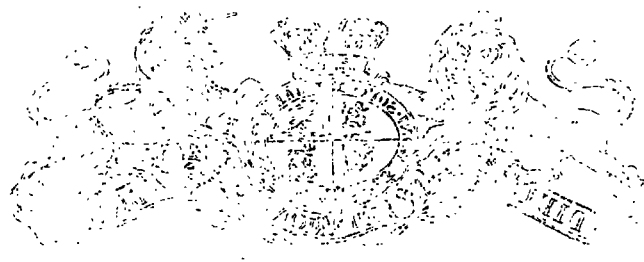
Her Majesty The Queen was present.
