NOTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Saturday, the 29th instant, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

N.B. The Knights of the several Orders are to appear at the Levee in their Collars, it being (St. Peter) a Collar-day.

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

WHEREAS Charles Neve Cresswell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law duly appointed in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882, as Commissioner for determining the boundaries of the wards of the borough of Jarrow and for apportioning the Councillors thereto has transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State his scheme in the following terms:—

"MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT

1882, 45 & 46 VICT. c. 50.

"BOROUGH OF JARROW.

"WHEREAS Her Majesty has been pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council and in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in Her Majesty by the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 to fix the number of wards into which the borough of Jarrow shall be divided and to order and direct that the said borough shall be divided into six wards which Order was made on the twenty-ninth day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

"And whereas on the twelfth day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State in pursuance of the 30th section of the said Act did duly warrant and appoint Charles Neve Cresswell Esquire, Barrister-at-Law to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of the wards of the borough of Jarrow, and for apportioning the Councillors among them as in the said Act directed.

"Now I the said Charles Neve Cresswell do hereby in pursuance of the said Warrant and appointment determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the six wards into which the said borough shall be divided which wards are hereinafter numbered and named as follows that is to say:—

"Ward No. 1 otherwise North Ward.

"Ward No. 2 otherwise Central Ward.

"Ward No. 3 otherwise East Ward.

" Ward No. 4 otherwise South Ward.

" Ward No. 5 otherwise Grange Ward.

" Ward No. 6 otherwise West Ward.

" And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 1 otherwise North Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the borough of Jarrow as is contained within a line commencing from a point in the boundary of the borough near the Horse and Cart Ferry landing at the Northern limit of the boundary line between the lands of the Jarrow Corporation and the South Shields Gas-Company thence in a southerly direction along the said line to a point opposite to the centre of Tyne-street, thence in an easterly direction to a point opposite to the centre of Ferry-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Ferry-street to a point opposite to the centre of Ormonde-street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Ormonde-street to a point opposite to the centre of Commercial-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Commercial-road to a point opposite to the centre of Grange-road, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Grange-road to a point opposite to the centre of Ellison-street thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Ellison-street to a point opposite to the centre of Ellison-place, thence in a northerly direction across the lands belonging to the 'Palmer Ship-building and Iron Company Limited' to the boundary of the borough on the River Tyne, thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 2 otherwise Central Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the borough of Jarrow as is contained within a line commencing from a point in the centre of Ellison-street opposite to the centre of Grange-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Ellison-street to a point opposite to the centre of William-street, thence along the centre of a road known as the Old Highway to the centre of the North Eastern Railway, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the said railway to a point beneath the centre of the railway bridge at Monkton-terrace, thence by a perpendicular line to the centre of the said bridge, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Monkton-terrace to a point opposite to the centre of High-street thence in an easterly direction along the centre of High-street to a point opposite to the centre of Princess-street thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Princess-street to a point opposite to the centre of Buddle-street, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Buddle-street to a point opposite to the centre of Pitt-street thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Pitt-street to the boundary of No. 1 Ward, thence in a southerly and westerly direction along the said boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 3 otherwise East Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the borough of Jarrow as is contained within a line commencing from the point already determined in the northern boundary of the borough near the Horse and Cart Ferry Landing, thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of No. 1 Ward to the point of its intersection with the boundary of No. 2 Ward, thence in an easterly and southerly direction along the said boundary to the centre of High-street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of High-street to a point opposite to the centre of the road known as Church Bank, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the said road to a

point opposite to the north-western corner of St. Paul's Churchyard, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the footway near the western wall of the said churchyard, thence in a southerly direction to the boundary of the borough in the centre of the River Don, thence in an easterly and northerly direction along the said boundary to the River Tyne, and thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundary of the borough to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 4 otherwise South Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the borough of Jarrow as is contained within a line commencing from the centre of Monkton-terrace Railway Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the southern boundary of Ward No. 2 to the boundary of Ward No. 3, thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary to the boundary of the borough in the River Don, thence in a southerly and westerly direction along the said boundary to a point opposite to the centre of Bede Burn-road near the Monkton Board Schools, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the Bede Burn-road to a point opposite to the boundary fence separating the Grange and Jarrow Estates, thence in an easterly and northerly direction along the line of the said fence to the end of Suffolk-street, thence to the centre of Hurworth-place, thence along the centre of Hurworth-place to a point opposite to the centre of Albert-road, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Albert-road to a point under the centre of the Iron Bridge of the North Eastern Railway, thence by a perpendicular line to the centre of the said bridge thence in an easterly direction along the said railway to a point beneath the centre of the Monkton-terrace Bridge and thence vertically to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" And I do hereby determine that the said ward No. 5 otherwise Grange Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the borough of Jarrow as is contained within a line commencing from the point already determined in the boundary of the borough near the Monkton Board Schools, thence in a south-westerly direction along the borough boundary to the south-western limit of the borough, thence in a northerly direction along the said boundary to its intersection with the North Eastern Railway, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the said railway to the Albert-road Iron Bridge, thence vertically to the centre of the Albert-road, and thence in a southerly direction along the western boundary of Ward No. 4 to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 6 otherwise West Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the borough of Jarrow as is contained within a line commencing from the point of intersection of the western boundary of the borough and of the North Eastern Railway thence in a northerly direction along the said boundary to the north-western corner of the borough on the River Tyne, thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary to the boundary of No 1 Ward, thence in a southerly direction along the western boundary of No. 1 Ward to the boundary of No. 2 Ward, thence in a southerly direction along the western boundary of No. 2 Ward to its intersection with the boundary of No. 5 Ward and thence in a westerly direction along the said boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" And I the said Charles Neve Cresswell in

further pursuance of the said Act and by virtue of the said Warrant of appointment and of the powers thereby created do hereby assign and apportion three Councillors to each and every ward as follows, that is to say :—

“To Ward No. 1 otherwise North Ward :—

(1) Joseph Thompson Dickinson, (2) George Albion Barrasford, (3) Zephaniah Harris.

“To Ward No. 2 otherwise Central Ward :—

(1) Thomas Renton, (2) William Robinson, (3) John Armstrong.

“To Ward No. 3 otherwise East Ward :—

(1) Hugh McGrorty, (2) Patrick Hanlon, (3) John Ray Russell.

“To Ward No. 4 otherwise South Ward :—

(1) John Rust, (2) Robert Reaveley, (3) Andrew Haig Holmes.

“To Ward No. 5 otherwise Grange Ward :—

(1) Matthew Dent, (2) John Thomas Oswald Penman, (3) George Johnson.

“To Ward No. 6 otherwise West Ward :—

(1) Andrew Frew, (2) Robert Archbold, (3) William Pearson.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 96 of The Animals Order of 1886, do hereby license the Local Authority for the West Riding of the county of York, to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcase or carcasses of one or more pigs which have recently been buried at Bramhope by Thomas H. Moore, subject to the following conditions :

1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause each carcase to be examined with a view to ascertain whether the animal or animals were affected with contagious or infectious disease, and the Local Authority shall then cause each carcase to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause it to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.
2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, examination, and re-burial of each carcase shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.
3. This Licence is revocable by the Privy Council.

STRAIT OF LE MAIRE.

Shoal off Cape San Diego.

INFORMATION has been received from Mr. S. G. Jones, commanding the British barque "Hermine," of the existence of shallower water on the foul ground extending off Cape San Diego, than has heretofore been known of:—

The barque in passing through the strait (and when keeping inshore, as recommended by Falkland Island coasters, to avoid the heavy and dangerous race then running in the strait), struck three or four times with the north-east extreme of the cape bearing N.W. by W., distant by estimation $1\frac{3}{4}$ miles, or nearly in the position of the five fathoms on the chart. The vessel was drawing 16 feet, which will for the present be accepted as the depth on the shoal.

The shoal is steep-to, no sounding at 10 fathoms being obtained directly before and after the vessel struck.

When subsequently in the race, at $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours flood, spring tides, the vessel sustained severe damage from the heavy seas that came on board. See South America Pilot, Part II, 1886, page 2, where vessels are recommended to wait until one hour after high water, before passing the Strait of Le Maire from the northward.
