NOTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Saturday, the 29th instant, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

N.B. The Knights of the several Orders are to appear at the Levee in their Collars, it being (St. Peter) a Collar-day.

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 96 of The Animals Order of 1886, do hereby license the Local Authority for the West Riding of the county of York, to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcase or part of the carcase of a certain head of cattle belonging to Mrs. Elizabeth Bennett, of Hanging Heaton, near Dewsbury, subject to the following conditions:

1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause the carcase or part of carcase to be examined with a view to ascertain whether the animal was affected with a contagious or infectious disease and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcase or part of carcase to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause it to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.
2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, examination, and re-burial of the carcase or part of carcase shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.
3. This Licence is revocable by the Privy Council.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies the following notice, dated the 3rd June, 1889, from the Governor of Malta relating to quarantine:—

GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to revoke Government Notice No. 18 of 8th February, 1888, and to modify Government Notices No. 70 of 26th and No. 71 of 29th April last, so that, subject to the undermentioned conditions, cattle may be imported from any port in the Mediterranean, Black Sea, or Sea of Azov not otherwise prohibited provided that in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer they be not affected with a disease which will not permit of their being admitted into the Lazaretto without detriment to cattle already in the Island.

Cattle from the Black Sea, Sea of Azov, or from any port which may be hereafter specified by the Board of Health shall only be admitted to the enclosures assigned for that purpose at the Lazaretto, or at such other place as the Government may select.

The owners of cattle in the Lazaretto shall be subject to such regulations as to slaughtering of cattle, disposal of offal, blood, &c., as may from time to time be made by the Superintendent of the Ports.

As the accommodation in the Lazaretto is limited, application must be made for leave to import, and such leave obtained in writing from Government in each case before shipment, stating the number of the animals intended to be shipped.

No cattle shall be allowed to be landed unless the consignee has obtained such leave from the Government.
