NORTH SEA.—GERMAN COAST.—WESER RIVER.

(1.) *Fog Signal at Hohe Weg Lighthouse.*

THE German Government has given notice, that on 28th May, 1889, a fog signal was established at Hohe Weg Lighthouse, west side of the entrance to Weser River :—

The signal is a bell, which, during thick or foggy weather, will be sounded twice (double stroke) every minute.

Position, lat. 53° 43' N., long. 8° 14½' E.

BALTIC.—RUSSIAN COAST.

(2.) *Libau—Occasional Fog Signal at South Mole Head.*

Information has been received, that when the whistle of an approaching steamer is heard at Libau, eastern shore of the Baltic, in thick or foggy weather, and during daylight when the lights are not exhibited, a fog signal will be made by a hand siren from the South Mole Head.

If the weather is sufficiently clear for the vessel to be found, the pilot will board her.

Flashing Light and Fog Signal on Gould Island.

THE United States Government has given notice, that on or about 10th June, 1889, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the north-eastern side of Gould Island, Eastern Passage, Narragansett Bay :—

The light is a flashing white light, showing a flash every ten seconds; it is elevated 50 feet
