NOTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Saturday, the 29th instant, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

N.B. The Knights of the several Orders are to appear at the Levee in their Collars, it being (St. Peter) a Collar-day.

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

An Area round Street Farm, Messing, in the county of Essex, in the occupation of Mr. Charles Moore, (which Farm is a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia), such Area extending from such Farm on the one side to Gorepit, and on another side to Messing Maypole, and extending up to, but not including, the road running from one to the other, on another side to the point where the road passing Harborough Hall joins the road from Maldon to Colchester, and extending up to, but not including, the road from that point to Messing Maypole, on another side to Fan Wood, thence in a straight line on the west side to Gorepit aforesaid, and on the east side in a straight line to the said point where the said road passing Harborough Hall joins the Maldon-road.

SAVINGS BANKS (INVESTMENT) REGULATIONS, 1889.

WHEREAS by the Savings Banks Act, 1880, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are empowered with the consent of the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt (hereinafter referred to as the National Debt Commissioner-), so far as any regulations relate to those Commissioners, and with the consent of the Postmaster-General, so far as any regulations relate to Post Office Savings Banks, from time to time to make, and when made to revoke, alter, or add to regulations in respect of the matters mentioned or referred to in the said Act.

And whereas by the Savings Banks Act, 1880, any deposit in a Trustee or Post Office Savings Bank, or any part of such deposit, may on the request of the depositor be invested by the Savings Bank Authority in any Government Stock.

And whereas by the National Debt and Local Loans Act, 1877, it is enacted that all persons and bodies of persons, including the National Debt Commissioners, having power, whether subject or not to any restrictions or conditions, to invest in any other stock of 3 per cent. perpetual annuities, shall have power, subject to the same restrictions and conditions, if any, to invest in Local Loans Stock.

And whereas under the provisions of the Savings Banks Act, 1880, Regulations were on the 24th day of July, 1888, made by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, with the consent of the National Debt Commissioners and Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, and it is expedient that further regulations should be made.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, under and by virtue of all powers and authorities vested in us in that behalf, do, with the consent of the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, and with the consent of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, make the following regulations, that is to say:—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited for all purposes as the Savings Banks (Investment) Regulations, 1889.

Commencement of Regulations.

2. These Regulations come into operation upon the 8th day of July, 1889.

Interpretation.

3. These Regulations shall be read as one with the Savings Banks (Investment) Regulations, 1888 (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations of 1888), and, subject as in these Regulations provided, expressions to which meanings are assigned by the Regulations of 1888 have in these Regulations the same respective meanings.

Extension of Regulations to Local Loans 3 per cent. Stock of Annuities.

4. The expression "Government Stock," as used in and for the purposes of the regulations of 1888 and these regulations, shall from the date of these regulations mean and include, in addition to the descriptions of stock in the regulations of 1888 expressly referred to, Local Loans 3 per cent. Stock of Annuities, as defined or referred to in the National Debt and Local Loans Act, 1887, and all the provisions of the regulations of 1888 shall apply to such Local Loans 3 per cent. Stock of Annuities in the same manner in all respects

as such regulations apply to the several descriptions of stock in the regulations of 1888 expressly referred to.

NOTE.—“Local Loans 3 per cent. Stock of Annuities” may be described as “Local Loans 3 per cent. Stock.”

The Treasury have made the foregoing Regulations under the Savings Banks Act, 1880 (43 and 44 Vict., c. 36).

The Tramways Act, 1870.

NOTICE is hereby given, that at a meeting of the Town Council of the Borough of Blackburn, held on the 5th day of June, 1889,

Bye-laws were made by the said Town Council as the Local Authority under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, and a copy of such Bye-laws is hereunder set forth.

Copy of Bye-laws.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations, the term "car" shall mean any engine or carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor, or other person having charge of an engine or carriage.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than three miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding eight miles an hour.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than 30 yards.

4. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 3 and 5, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made, provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

5. Except at a passing place or terminus no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

6. The driver of a car on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall with reasonable despatch cause such vehicle to be removed, so as not to obstruct the car.

7. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

8. The driver of every car along Freckleton-street, from St. Peter's-street to King-street, shall not drive such car at a greater speed than four miles an hour, and the driver of every such car shall cause the same to be brought to a standstill in Freckleton-street immediately before passing into King-street.

9. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s. for each offence, and not exceeding, for any continuing offence, 10s. for every day during which the offence continues.

10. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 2nd day of September, 1889.

The Tramways Act, 1870.

NOTICE is hereby given, that at a Meeting of the Town Council of the Borough of Blackburn, held on the 6th day of June, 1889, Bye-laws were made by the said Town Council as the Promoters under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, and a copy of such Bye-laws is hereunder set forth.

COPY OF BYE-LAWS.

Definition.

For the purpose of these bye-laws, the term "Corporation" shall mean the Mayor, Aldermen, No. 25949. C

and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackburn; the term "Company" shall mean the Blackburn Corporation Tramways Company Limited; the term "Tramways" shall mean the tramways authorized by the Blackburn Improvement Act, 1882, or any of those tramways; the term "Carriage" shall mean any car or carriage using the tramways; and the terms "Driver" and "Conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

Entering Carriages.

1. No person not being a servant of the Company shall enter or depart from a carriage except by the hindermost or conductor's platform.

Smoking.

2. No person shall smoke inside any carriage.

Playing Instruments.

3. No person shall, whilst travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Intoxication.

4. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or mount upon any carriage, and if any such person is found in or upon any carriage he shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Offensive Language.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Damaging Carriages.

6. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number, plate, printed, or other notice in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-Laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

7. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Fares.

8. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey.

9. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Artisans.

10. No person not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Blackburn Improvement Act, 1882, and the Acts incorporated therewith, shall

use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Mode of Travelling.

11. No person not being a servant of the Company shall travel on any engine running upon the tramways, or on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage.

Number of Passengers.

12. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage, when warned by the conductor not to do so.

13. The conductor shall not permit any passenger, beyond the licensed number, to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

Entering or Leaving Carriage in Motion.

14. No person shall enter, mount, or leave or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

Dogs and Animals.

15. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of any carriage nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal is offensive or an annoyance to any passenger shall the same be allowed on the outside of any carriage. No person shall take a dog or other animal on any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken, or being on any carriage in breach of this Bye-law, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms.

16. No person shall travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or with any combustible or dangerous substance or material.

Obstructing Officers.

17. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation or the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with the tramways, or any carriage thereon.

Enforcing Bye-laws.

18. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

Penalty.

19. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of the above Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding, for any continuing offence, ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

Copy of Bye-laws.

20. The Company shall cause to be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

21. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 2nd day of September, 1889.
