GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board. Suspension in part of General Order: Medical Officer's Fees.
Sheffield Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Sheffield Union, in the County Borough of Sheffield and the County of the West Riding of Yorkshire;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Poor Law Commissioners, by a General Order bearing date the Twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, made certain rules and regulations relating to the administration of relief to the

Poor within certain Unions, including the said Sheffield Union; and by Articles 177, 182, and 183 of the said Order provision was made for the payment of special fees to Medical Officers in certain cases:

And whereas the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union, in pursuance of the provisions of Article 158 of the said General Order, have divided the Union into Districts for Medical Relief, and one of such Districts is termed the "South East District"

And whereas it is expedient to suspend, as hereinafter mentioned, the operation of the said Articles 177, 182, and 183 as regards the Medical Officer for the said "South East District," and also to suspend, as regards the Medical Officer for the Workhouse of the said Union, the operation of the said Article 182:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby suspend the operation, until we by Order shall otherwise direct, of Articles 177, 182, and 183 of the abovecited Order with respect to the Medical Officer for the time being for the said "South East District," in the said Sheffield Union, and of Article 182 of the said Order with respect to the Medical Officer for the time being of the Workhouse of the said Union.

(1.) Aranci Bay-Harbour Light on Mole, Mooring Buoys.

THE Italian Government has given notice, dated 21st June, 188), that a harbour light is now exhibited from an iron post erected on the head of the mole, constructed by the Sardinian Railway Company on the eastern side of Aranci Bay, and which extends in a south-westerly direction from the shore for a distance of 240 yards :-

NORTH AMERICA—WEST COAST.—CALIFORNIA. Point Sur-Flashing Light and Fog Signal on Moro Rock.

THE United States Government has given notice, that on or about 1st August, 1889, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected near the western end of Moro Rock, Point Sur :

The light will be a flashing light of the first order, giving alternately a red flash and a white flash every fifteen seconds; it will be elevated 270 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 23 miles.

The lighthouse consists of a square gray stone tower, with black lantern, rising from near the middle of a rectangular gray stone building, containing the fog signal machinery. The keeper's dwelling, $2\frac{1}{2}$ stories high, of gray stone, with red shingled roof, stands about 330 yards eastward of the lighthouse.

Approximate position on Admiralty Charts, lat. 36° 19½′ N., long. 121° 52½′ W.

Also, that a fog signal will be established at

Point Sur Lighthouse :-The signal will be a 12-inch steam whistle,

which, during thick and foggy weather, will give blasts of five seconds duration at intervals of twenty seconds.

THE Naval Commander-in-Chief at Portsmouth has, on behalf of the Admiralty, issued the following regulations to be observed by all vessels at Spithead and in its vicinity on the occasion of the Inspection of the Fleet to be held

on 3rd August, 1889:—
1. In order to reduce as far as possible the chances of collision, Directors of Steamship Companies, Owners of Steam Vessels, Yachts, &c., are earnestly requested to give directions to the masters of their ships to follow closely the instructions herein laid down, and to pay implicit attention to the requests of the Officers of the Patrol Tugs and Boats, who will be specially charged with the duty of keeping clear the inspection ground.

2. The speed of steam vessels when within the

columns is to be limited to five knots.

3. All steam vessels present are requested to burn the best Welsh coal, so that smoke may not obstruct the view of the fleet nor cause danger of collision. Vessels neglecting to follow this rule will be removed to a distance.

4. Previous to the hour fixed for the Inspection, private steam vessels, steam yachts, and sailing vessels are to be permitted to pass between the columns under the following regulations:-

5. Up to 11 A.M., no special restrictions are

necessary.

6. From 11 A.M. to 2 P.M., and again after the Royal Yachts have left, the course of vessels through the different columns of men-of-war is to be as follows:

(a.) North of the central column and between it and the northern column, from west to east.

(b.) South of the central column and between it and the southern column, and thence through the lines of the German squadron, or to assigned anchorage, from east to west.

(c.) South of the southern column of the large

ships composing the squadrons, and at about a cable's distance from them, from west to east.

(d.) Vessels on arriving at the eastern end of the southern line, must turn to starboard and proceed westward on a line southward and clear of the track they have just followed, passing southward of "Hecla."

7. After 2 P.M. (on a signal gun being fired from Her Majesty's ship "Collingwood"), no private steam vessel is to enter the inspection ground, and all sailing vessels and boats are to

be clear of the lines by the same time.

8. The inspection ground is considered to be the space included by a line drawn round the men-of-war at anchor, the buoy (with red flag) N. by W. 3 W., nine cables from the N.E. Ryde Middle Buoy, and the German Squadron, at the distance of about two cables from the outermost

The approaches to the inspection ground from Cowes, north of the Ryde Middle, and from the south-eastward as far as the line joining the Horse and Norman Forts, are also to be kept clear of vessels and boats, to enable the pro-

9. The anchorage between the limits of lines drawn S.W. by S. from East and West Sturbridge Buoys will be reserved for steam vessels that are on the special Admiralty List. 10. Small vessels must anchor upon or close to the Mother Bank, Ryde Middle, Horse and Dean

Sands, or in Stokes Bay.

11. During the time of the Inspection of the Fleet, no steam vessel, sailing vessel or boat, will be permitted to cross the line of the ships of war, nor pass between the columns, nor to occupy any part of the fairway channel, between Cowes and the western limit of the fleet, nor of the main channel between Spithead and St. Helen's Road.

12. Great caution must be observed by the smaller steam vessels and sailing craft entering the main channel to Portsmouth Harbour from the
