

The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Place which is declared by order of the Bromley Divisional Committee of the Local Authority for the county of Kent, dated the seventeenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—the extent of Coopers and Slough Farms, at Bromley, in the county of Kent, in the occupation of Alfred Bourne,—are hereby contracted or altered so as only to include the Place as described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place so described in the Schedule to this Order shall from and after the commencement of this Order be deemed to be the Place declared by the said order of the Local Authority to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twentieth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.
