GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board (Metropolitan School Districts).
Exclusion of Certain Classes of Children:—

To the Boards of Management of the Central London, South Metropolitan, North Surrey, West London, Forest Gate, and Kensington and Chelsea School Districts;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and Parishes comprised in the said School Districts respectively;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain Orders of the Poor Law Board and the Local Government Board the School Districts above-named were formed for the management of the Infant Poor chargeable to the Unions and Parishes in such Districts respectively, not being above the age of sixteen years; and by the said Orders Boards of Management of the said Districts were constituted;

And whereas by certain other Orders of the Poor Law Board and the Local Government Board, regulations were prescribed for the government of the Schools of the said Districts respectively, including regulations as to the admission of children into the said Schools; and it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned in regard to the admission of children into the said Schools:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that, notwithstanding anything contained in any of the Orders above referred to, the following regulations shall have effect in regard to the admission of children into any School of any of the above-named School Districts:—

ARTICLE I.—No child under the age of three years shall be admitted into any of the said Schools.

ARTICLE II.—Subject to the provisions of Article III of this Order, no Child suffering from any affection of the scalp or of the skin or of the eyes shall be admitted into any of the said Schools; and the Order of Admission to be signed by the Clerk to the Guardians of a Union or Parish prior to the admission of any child into the District School from such Union or Parish shall not be given unless the Medical Officer of the Workhouse of such Union or Parish has examined the child on the day of the proposed removal of the child to the School, or on the day immediately preceding, and has signed a Certificate in the following Form, which Certificate the Medical Officer of such Workhouse is hereby required to give, upon the request of the Master of such Workhouse, in every case in which, after due examination, he may find the child to be as therein described; that is to say,—

I, the undersigned, do hereby certify that I have this day personally examined

, and that he is, in my judgment, free from any affection of the scalp, of the skin, or of the eyes, and that he is in such a state of health as will permit of his taking part at once

in the ordinary discipline and occupations of the School.

ARTICLE III. If in the case of any of the said Schools separate accommodation, with administration and a staff of officers entirely distinct from those at the said Schools, has been or may hereafter with our consent be provided to our satisfaction for children suffering from an affection of the scalp, or of the skin, or of the eyes, children suffering from the affection for which such provision is so made may be admitted into the School, and in any such case the Medical Officer of the Workhouse shall, in lieu of the Certificate required to be given by him in pursuance of Article II of this Order, sign a Certificate in the following Form:—

ARTICLE IV.—The provisions of the Orders above referred to in regard to the admission of children into the said schools shall apply as heretofore, except in so far as they are inconsistent with the provisions of this Order.

ARTICLE V.—This Order shall come into operation from and after the first day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.
