And whereas by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1876, it is enacted that "where Her Majesty has * power under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, " or any Act passed or hereafter to be passed "amending the same to make an Order in " Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from " time to time to make such Order in Council, " and by Order in Council to revoke, alter, or add " to any Order so made":

And whereas it was made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of Merchant ships in force under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, had been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the German Emperor, with the exception of a difference in the mode in certain steamers of estimating the allowance for engine room, and such rules were in force in that country and came into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three :

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand eight

And whereas it has been made to appear desirable to Her Majesty that the provisions of the said recited Order in Council of the twentysixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, should be revoked, and a new Order in Council made and substituted in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in virtue of the -powers-vested in Her-by the said recited Acts, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the said recited Order of the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, shall be and the same is hereby revoked, and in lieu thereof, and in substitution therefor, Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows :--

1. As regards sailing ships, that Merchant 'sailing ships of the said German Empire, the measurement whereof after the said first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner and to the same extent, and for the same purpose into and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.

2. As regards steam ships, that Merchant ships belonging to the said German Empire, which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steam ships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted on such registers or other national papers in the same manner and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships. Provided, nevertheless, that if the Owner or Master of any such German steam ship desires the deduction for engine room in his ship to be estimated under the rules for engine room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the German rule, the engine room shall be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules; and that, in the event of any such steam ship possessing a certificate of tonnage or other national paper issued as aforesaid on or after the twentieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-cight, denoting the net registered tonnage of such ship under the British rules, the ship shall be deemed to be of the tonnage so denoted thereon. The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W HEREAS by section 5 of the "Merchant Seamen (Payment of Wages and Rating) Act, 1880," it is provided that, where a ship is

about to arrive, is arriving, or has arrived, at the end of her voyage, every person not being in Her Majesty's service, or not being duly authorized by law for the purpose, who---

- (a.) Goes on board the ship without the permission of the master before the seamen lawfully leave the ship at the end of their engagement or are discharged -(whichever last happens); or
- (b.) Being on board the ship remains there after being warned to leave by the master, or by a police officer, or by any officer of

the Board of Trade or of the Customs, shall for every such offence be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds or at the discretion of the Court, to imprisonment for any term not exceeding six months; and the master of the ship, or any officer of the Board of Trade may take him into custody and deliver him up forthwith to a constable to be taken before a Court or Magistrate capable of taking cognizance of the offence and dealt with according to law:

And whereas by section 6 of the said Act it is further provided that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty—

- (1.) That the Government of any foreign country has provided that unauthorised persons going on board of British ships which are about to arrive or have arrived within its territorial jurisdiction shall be subject to provisions similar to the provisions contained in the last preceding section as applicable to persons going on board British ships at the end of their voyages; and
- (2.) That the Government of such foreign country is desirous that the provisions of the said section shall apply to unauthorised persons going on board of ships belonging to such foreign country within the limits of British territorial jurisdiction:

Her Majesty may by Order in Council declare that the provisions of the said last preceding section shall apply to the ships of such country, and thereupon, so long as the Order remains in force, those provisions shall apply and have effect as if the ships of such country were British ships arriving, about to arrive, or which had arrived, at the end of their voyage :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty-

That the Government of Belgium has provided as aforesaid and is desirous that the provisions of the said fifth section shall apply to unauthorized persons going on board of Belgian ships within the limits of British territorial jurisdiction :

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to declare that the provisions of the said recited fifth section of the "Merchant Seamen (Payment of Wages and Rating) Act, 1880," shall apply to Belgian ships. W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twentieth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the powers of section twenty-six of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four (being the New Parishes Act 1856) have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the parish of East Woodhay, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester, and with respect to the new parish

of Woolton Hill in the same county and diocese. "Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council made the nineteenth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-first day of the same month, a certain district taken wholly out of the said parish of East Woodhay, was created and was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Thomas situate at Woolton Hill in the same parish, and was named the district chapelry of Woolton Hill.

"And whereas by virtue of the said Act, the said district chapelry of Woolton Hill became as from the date of the passing of the same Act a new parish; and the said district chapelry is now the new parish of Woolton Hill aforesaid.

"And whereas by a certain deed of grant dated the sixteenth day of October in the said year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and made under the Act of the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter forty-five the annual sum of one hundred pounds was charged upon all the annual revenues of the benefice of East Woodhay ; that is to say, of the rectory of the parish of East Woodhay aforesaid, in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said church (in the same deed called a chapel) of Saint Thomas at Woolton Hill (which Incumbent is the Incumbent of the new parish of Woolton Hill aforesaid) and his successors.

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the fifth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one and published in the London Gazette on the fourteenth day of the same month, it was amongst other things ordered that the lands tithes rentcharges in lieu of tithes, and other (if any other) endowments then belonging or thereafter to belong to the said benefice of East Woodhay should as from the then next avoidance (which has since happened) of that benefice be chargeable and charged in favour of the Incumbent of the benefice of Woolton Hill (being the new parish of Woolton Hill aforesaid) and his successors with one clear annual sum of fifty pounds in addition to the said annual charge of one hundred pounds created in favour of the same lastmentioned bencfice by the said deed of the sixteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and fifty.

"And whereas the Reverend Newton John Spicer, Clerk in Holy Orders, is now the Incum-bent Rector of the said benefice and pari h of East Woodhay.

"And whereas the Reverend John Hector Robinson, Clerk in Holy Orders, is now the Incumbent Vicar of the said benefice and new parish of Woolton Hill.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Harold, Bishop of Winchester, is as such Bishop the patron both of the said benefice of East Woodhay, and also of the said benefice of Woolton Hill.

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it appears to us to be expedient, that under the terms of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, the annexation and resettlement of tithes, rentcharges or other endowments which is by this scheme hercinafter recommended, shall be made for the benefit of the said parish of East Wood-hay and of the said new parish of Woolton Hill.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Edward Harold Bishop of Winchester, acting as such patron of the said benefice and parish of East Woodhay and also of the said benefice and parish of Woolton Hill (in testimony of which consent he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the said Newton John Spicer, incumbent rector of the said benefice and parish of East Woodhay and of the said John Hector Robinson, incumbent vicar of the said benefice and new parish of Woolton Hill (in testimony of which consent they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme) we humbly recommend and propose, that as from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole of the rectorial tithe rent-charges now and heretofore belonging to the said benefice of East Woodhay which arise within the limits of the said new parish of Woolton Hill, which tithe rent-charges are of the commuted value of two hundred and fifty-two pounds and two pence shall cease to belong to the incumbent of the said benefice of East Woodhay, and shall be transferred and annexed to the said benefice and new parish of Woolton Hill (within the limits of which they arise as aforesaid) and shall thenceforth belong to and be vested in the incumbent of the same benefice and new parish and his successors for ever.

" And we further and with the same consents as aforesaid so testified as aforesaid recommend and propose that as from the day aforesaid, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than as aforesaid, the said annual charge of one hundred pounds, created by the said deed of grant of the sixteenth day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, in favour of the said benefice of Woolton Hill, and the said annual charge of fifty pounds, created in favour of the same benefice by the said Order of Your-Majesty in Council of the fifth day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, shall : and each of them shall, absolutely cease and determine; the rectorial tithe rent-charges by this scheme proposed to be transferred and annexed as aforesaid to the said benefice and new : parish of Woolton Hill being so transferred and annexed (as the several consenting parties to this scheme do hereby severally declare) in compensation for, and as a just and full equivalent by way of annexation and resettlement for, the same two annual charges of one hundred pounds and : fifty pounds respectively.

" And we fur her recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from hereafter recommending and proposing to Your -Majesty in Council any other matters and things relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, under the powers of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; n w, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, "And whereas it has been proposed to us, and I and to order and direct that the same and every

part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice of Saint Oswald-in-Lee with Saint Mary Bingfield in the county of Northumberland and in the diocese of Newcastle between that benefice and a certain other benefice namely the benefice of Saint John Lee, which said last-named benefice is also situate in the said county of Northumberland and in the said diocese of Newcastle.

"Whereas Wentworth Blackett Beaumont of No. 144, Piccadilly-terrace in the county of Middlesex Esquire, a Member of the Commons House of Parliament is the patron of the said benefice of Saint Oswald-in-Lee, with Saint Mary Bingfield and also of the said benefice of Saint John Lee.

"And whereas the present endowments of the said benefice of Saint Oswald-in-Lee, with Saint Mary Bingfield comprise amongst other things, first the messuages or tenements tithe commuta-tion rent-charges and other hereditaments which are particularly described in the schedule to this scheme annexed, and secondly two several sums of stock in the same schedule specified, which sums of stock (as by the same schedule appears) are held in favour of the same benefice by the Governors of the Bcunty of Queen Anne for the augmentation of the maintenance of the poor clergy.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest Roland, Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle acting as such Bishop, and with the consent of the said Wentworth Blackett Beaumont, acting as the patron as aforesaid of each of the said two benefices, to wit, the benefice of Saint Oswald-in-Lee, with Saint Mary, Bingfield, and the benefice of Saint John, Lee, and also with the consent of the said Robert Hutton, acting as incumbent as aforesaid of the said benefice of Saint Oswald-in-Lee with Saint Mary Bingfield (in testimony whereof they the said consenting partics have respectively signed and sealed this scheme, the Bishop sealing the same with his episcopal seal).

"We the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall have been published in the London Gazette all and singular the messuages or tenements lands tithe commutation rent-charges corn tithes and other hereditaments which are particularly described in the said schedule to this scheme annexed and also the whole of the said two several sums of stock which are described in the same schedule shall be transferred by way of apportionment from the said benefice of Saint Oswald-in-Lee with Saint Mary Bingfield to the said benefice of Saint John Lee, and shall as from the day aforesaid be annexed to and form part of the endowments of the said benefice of Saint John Lee and that accordingly the said sums of stock shall as from that day be held by the said Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne in favour of the said benefice of Saint John, Lee, and as part of the endowments thereof.

NOTICE under "The Passengers Act, 1855," varying the Declared Length of Voyage to certain Places for certain Passenger Ships.

WHEREAS by the thirtieth section of "The Passengers Act, 1855," it is enacted for the purposes of the Act, the length of voyage for a passenger ship proceeding from the United Kingdom to the several places therein mentioned shall be determined by a scale therein set forth, and that for the like purposes the Emigration Commissioners, acting by and under the authority of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by notice in writing issued under the hands. of any two of such Commissioners, and published in the London Gazette, may, nevertheless, declare what shall be deemed to be the length of voyage from the United Kingdom to any of such place. or to any other port or place whatsoever, and may fix such different length of voyage as they may think reasonable for different descriptions of vessels.

And whereas it was deemed expedient to vary the said scale, and to reduce the length of voyage from the United Kingdom to North America in the said scale set forth, as regards passenger ships propelled by steam engines, at a rate of not less than ten statute miles an hour, and Her Majesty's Emigration Commissioners, having obtained the necessary authority in that behalf of Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, did by notice, dated the fourth June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and published in the London Gazette of the seventh June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, declare that the length of voyage from the United Kingdom to North America (except the West Coast thereof) should for the purposes of the said Passengers Act, 1855, be as follows, that is to say :-- For passenger ships propelled by steam engines of sufficient power to propel the ship without the aid of sails at the rate of not less than ten statute miles an hour, if the ship clears out between the sixteenth day of January and the fourteenth day of October, both days inclusive, thirty-two days; and if the ship clears out between the fifteenth day of October and the fifteenth day of January, both days inclusive, thirty-seven days.

And whereas by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1872," all the powers and duties vested in or imposed on the Emigration Commissioners by Passengers Act, 1855," and "The "The Passengers Act Amendment Act, 1863," are transferred to and imposed on the Board of Trade, and may be exercised by the said Board of Trade independently of the sanction or authority of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.
