AT the Council Chumber, Whitehall, the 3rd day of August, 1889.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Area which is declared by Order of Council, dated the eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—the High Ground Farm, situate in the township of Hellifield, in the West Ridding of the county of York, in the occupation of John Coates, and other lands in the said township all comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at a point on the Keighley and Kendal-road where the western fence of Waspber Hill Meadow adjoins such road and proceeding by such fence to the Midland Railway, thence along such Railway to the corner of Denbys Pasture adjoining the Railway and so along the fence of Denbys Pasture to a point where the same adjoins Causeway Syke, thence along the fence and Causeway Syke in an easterly direction to a point where the same adjoins Pitts Pasture, theuce by the southern fence of Pitts Pasture to Coniston Moor and so along the western fence of Coniston Moor by Switchers Bottom to the Keighley and Kendal turnpike-road, thence along such road to the point where the Hellifield township boundary crosses such road, thence by such boundary past Hall Field Farms to the fence dividing Grey Stones and Mallardale Pastures, thence along such fence to the bridleroad leading to Swinden Hall, thence by such bridle-road to a point where the Lancashire and Yorkshire Ruilway crosses such road, thence along the fence of such Railway to a point where Hall Croft or Hellifield Park fence adjoins the Railway, thence along the fence of Hall Croft or Hellifield Park and Tenley Plantation to the western fence of Tenley Pasture where the same adjoins the said Plantation, and thence in an easterly direction along Tenley Pasture fence and across the Keighley and Kendal turnpike-road to the point

first-mentioned,—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

An Area including the High Ground Farm, situate in the township of Hellifield, in the West Riding of the county of York, in the occupation of John Coates, and other lands in the said township all comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing where the northerly point of the western fence of Waspber Hill Meadow adjoins the Midland Railway, thence along such Railway to the corner of Denbys Pasture adjoining the Railway and so along the fence of Denbys Pasture to a point where the same adjoins Causeway Syke, thence along the force and Causeway Syke, thence along the fence and Causeway Syke in an easterly direction to a point where the same adjoins Pitts Pasture, thence by the southern fence of Pitts Pasture to Coniston Moor and so along the western fence of Coniston Moor by Switchers Bottom to the Keighley and Kendal turnpike-road, thence along such road to the point where the Hellifield township boundary crosses such road, thence by such boundary past Hall Field Farms to the fence dividing Grey Stones and Mallardale Pastures, thence along such fence to the bridle-road leading to Swinden Hall up to Swinden Hall, thence along the northerly fence of Mill-lane to its junction with the Marsdev, Gisburn, and Longpreston-road, thence across such roal and along the opposite fence to the river Ribble, thence up the said river to where Pan Beck enters it, thence up Pan Beck and Gallaber Syke to the junction with the Marsden, Gisburn, and Longpreston-road, thence down the southern side of such road in a southerly direction along such road to Boggart-lane, thence along the southern fence of such lane past the southerly side of Hellifield Green through Hellifield Village to the point where Howe-lane meets the Keighley and Kendal turnpike-road, thence up the said lane to the junction with the Midland Railway and along the Railway to the point first mentioned.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Surbiton, in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the south the main line of the London and South-Western Railway, on the north-west a lane known as Clay Hill leading from the Bridge over the Railway known as King Charles Road Bridge to Kingston, and on the north-east a lane known as Upper Marsh-lane leading from Clay Hill to a wooden bridge crossing the London and South-Western Railway,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swincfever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.
