CEREMONIAL observed at the Marriage of HER ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCESS LOUISE VICTORIA ALEXANDRA DAGMAR, Eldest Daughter of THEIR ROYAL HIGHNESSES THE PRINCE and PRINCESS OF WALES, with ALEXANDER WILLIAM GEORGE, EARL OF FIFE, K.T., in the Private Chapel of Buckingham Palace, on Saturday, the 27th of July, 1889, at 12 o'clock.

Her Majesty's invited Guests arrived at the Pinlico entrance to the Palace at 11.30 o'clock, and were conducted to their places in the Chapel by Her Majesty's Gentlemen Ushers.

The Archbishop of Canterbury, The Bishop of London (Dean of Her Majesty's Chapels Royal), The Very Reverend The Dean of Windsor (Domestic Chaplain to The Queen), The Reverend F. A. J. Hervey, M.A. (Domestic Chaplain to His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales), and The Reverend T. Teignmouth Shore, M.A., likewise arrived by the Pimlico entrance, and assembled in the Robing Room, and from thence were conducted to their places within the altar rails in the Chapel at 11.45 o'clock, whilst a "Marche Nuptiale," composed by Mr. Jekyll, was played on the Organ.

The Bridegroom arrived privately at 11.40 o'clock, and was shown with his supporter and Best Man, Mr. Horace Farquhar, to the New Luncheon Room, where he remained until summoned for the Ceremony.

Her Royal Highness The Princess of Wales, with His Majesty The King of the Hellenes, K.G., Their Royal Highnesses The Crown Prince of Denmark, G.C.B., The Prince Albert Victor and Prince George of Wales, left Marlborough House, with a Field Officer's Escort of the 2nd Life Guards, under the command of Colonel Townshend, at 11.30 o'clock, and arrived at the Grand Entrance at Buckingham Palace at 11.40 o'clock, and were conducted to the Bow Library.

Her Royal Highness was attended by The Lord Colville of Culross, K.T., Chamberlain, The Lady Emily Kingscote, and Miss Knollys, Lady and Woman of the Bedchamber to Her Royal Highness; His Majesty The King of the Hellenes by The Earl of Romney, Lord in Waiting to The Queen, and by Colonel Hadjipetros; His Royal Highness The Crown Prince of Denmark by Captain Bull and Colonel Stanley Clarke, C.M.G., Equerry to The Prince of Wales; and His Royal Highness The Prince Albert Victor of Wales, by Captain Holford.

His Royal Highness The Grand Duke of Hesse, K.G., and the other Members of The Royal Family, who had arrived by the Grand Entrance with Their Attendants, were also conducted to the Bow Library, where they assembled at 11.45 o'clock and awaited the arrival of The Queen from the Private Apartments.

On reaching the Chapel The Queen was conducted to the chair prepared for Hcr Majesty, His Majesty The King of the Hellenes, K.G., Their Royal Highnesses The Grand Duke of Hesse, K.G., The Crown Prince of Denmark, G.C.B., and The Princess of Wales to chairs near Her Mujesty, and the other Royal Guests to seats on either side of the Altar.

The Queen and The Royal Family having been conducted to their places in the Chapel, The Vice-Chamberlain then proceeded to the new Luncheon Room, and conducted The Bridegroom to the Chapel, whilst a march from "Tannhäuser" was played on the Organ. The Bridegroom, with his Supporter, took his place on the right of the Altar Rails, where he waited the arrival of 'The Bride.

His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., with Her Royal Highness The Bride, and Their Royal Highnesses The Princesses Victoria and Maud of Wales, left Marlborough House, with a Subaltern's Escort of Royal Horse Guards, under the Command of Lieutenant Williams, at 11.4C o'clock, attended by The Lord Suffield, K.C.B., Lord of the Bedchamber, General Sir D. M. Probyn, K.C.B., K.C.S.I., V.C., Comptroller and Treasurer of the Household, Sir Francis Knollys, K.C.M.G., C.B., Private Secretary, and Major-General Arthur Ellis, C.S.I., Equerry to His Royal Highness, and arrived, by The Mall, St. James's Park, at the Grand Entrance to Buckingham Palace, at 11.50 o'clock.

The Queen afterwards proceeded, with The Royal Family, to the Picture Gallery, and received the congratulations of Her Majesty's Guests.

The Bride and Bridegroom then returned, from the Grand Entrance, at 2.30 o'clock, to Marlborough House in The Earl of Fife's Carriage with a Subaltern's Escort of The Royal Horse Guards, followed by Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales, with His Majesty The King of the Hellenes, K.G., and His Royal Highness The Crown Prince of Denmark, G.C.B., with a Field Officer's Escort of the 2nd Life Guards, as on arrival, the Route being by Constitution Hill, Piccadilly, and St. James's Street.

After taking leave of The Bride and Bridegroom, The Queen witnessed their departure from Buckingham Palace from the Balcony over the Grand Archway.

The Earl of Lathom, The Lord Chamberlain, and The Duke of Portland, Master of the Horse, were unavoidably absent.

Her Majesty's Body Guard of Yeomen of the Guard were on duty in the Grand Hall, under the Command of The Earl of Limerick, the Captain; Colonel F. Baring, The Clerk of the Cheque and Adjutant, being on duty with the Corps.
