(PORT OF LEITH.—APPROVAL OF LANDING-PLACE FOR FOREIGN ANIMALS.)

HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of the following part of the Port of Leith as a landing-place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine:

All that space in the parish of South Leith, in the county of Edinburgh, situated on the north side of the Albert Dock Basin, commencing at a point at the water's edge three hundred and forty-eight feet west of the East Quay of the said Basin, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of twelve feet bounded by high wooden gates, thence in an easterly direction for a distance of two hundred and fifty-two feet six inches bounded by the side of the cattle sheds and a high wooden fence, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of one hundred and five feet bounded by a high wooden fence, thence in a westerly direction for a distance of four hundred

and forty-three feet bounded by a high wooden fence, thence in a southerly direction for a distance of twenty-five feet bounded by a high wooden fence, thence in an easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and seventy-three feet six inches bounded by a high wooden fence and the side of the cattle sheds, thence in a southerly direction for a distance of twelve feet to the water's edge bounded by high wooden gates, and thence along the edge of the wall of the North Quay of the said Albert Dock Basin for a distance of twelve feet to the point first-mentioned, all which space is edged pink on the plan of the said Landing Place deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the burgh of Leith.

All that space on the south side of the Alfred Dock, in the township of Poulton-cum-Scacombe, in the county of Chester, bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the coping lines of the south and cast sides of the said Dock, thence continuing along the coping line of the south side of the said Dock three hundred and seventy-six feet or thereabouts, thence continuing in a southwardly direction ninety-five feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly one hundred and sixty-five feet or thereabouts, thence in a curve westwardly, southwardly, and eastwardly forty-eight feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly five hundred and fortyfive feet or thereabouts, thence northwardly one hundred and sixty-six feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly twenty-six feet or thereabouts, and thence northwardly seventy-three feet or thereabouts to the point of commencement at the said intersection of the coping lines of the south and east sides of the said Dock, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of the said Landing-Place deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the County Council for the county of Chester.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. In accordance with the provisions contained in Article 99 of The Animals Order of 1886, every Local Authority in England and Wales and Scotland is hereby authorized to make, from time to time during the continuance of this Order, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of swine-fever, such Regulations as to the Local Authority seem expedient for prohibiting or regulating the exposure or sale of swine in or at any Market, Fair, Auction, Sale-yard, Sale, or Exhibition within their District (not being within the limits of a Swine-Fever Infected Area), subject however and according to the conditions, provisions, and regulations applicable thereto under The Animals Order of 1886.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and shall cease to operate from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety; and all Regulations made under this Order shall be expressed accordingly to terminate not later than at such latter date.

3.—(1.) Every Local Authority shall for hwith send to the Privy Council a copy of every Regulation made by them under the authority of this Order.

(2.) If the Privy Council are satisfied on inquiry with respect to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under the authority of this Order that the same is of too restrictive a character, or otherwise objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

4. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.
