By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Place which is declared by order of the Sub-Executive Committee for the Elloe Division of the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, dated the sixteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be a Place infected with swine-fever (namely),—the home pig-yards of Mr. William James Whitsed at his home Farmstead at Gedney Hill, and all sheds and the stack-yard and grassfield on the west side of and contiguous to the said Farmstead,—are hereby extended so as to include the Place described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.
