

Her present Majesty, intituled "The Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874," I, Sir Brydges Powell Henniker, Bart., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, have, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, ordered and declared that on and after the 1st day of October next, the Bethnal Green District shall be re-arranged into three Sub-Districts, namely:—The "Bethnal Green North" Sub-District, comprising that portion of the parish situate north of the Bethnal Green-road and west of the Cambridge-road, including the north side of the Bethnal Green-road; the "Bethnal Green South" Sub-District, comprising that portion of the parish situate south of the Bethnal Green-road and west of the Cambridge-road, including the south side of the Bethnal Green-road; and the "Bethnal Green East" Sub-District, comprising both sides of the Cambridge-road and all that portion of the parish to the east of it.—Witness my hand this 26th day of August, 1889.
