AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 6th day of September, 1889.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Places which are declared by orders of the Local Authority for the county of Ayr to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—(1.) the Farm of Corsehill, in the parish of Stewarton, in the county of Ayr, in the occupation of D. Thomson, and (2.) the three fields at Lainshaw Mains, in the parish of Stewarton, in the county of Ayr, in the occupation of G. Dunlop,—are hereby respectively extended so as to include the several Places described in the Schedule to this Order, and the several Places described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The

Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Middop, in the West Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at Burnley-road opposite Cragg Farm House and thence by a stone fence on the side of Lower Meadow to Sunnybank Pasture, thence by Park Beck to Hanging Cliff, thence by the fence adjoining Sunnybank Pasture to the township boundary, continuing by the township boundary to Howgill, thence by Howgill-road to Burnley-road, thence by Todber old-road past Howgill Moor to the old-road leading to Colne, thence by this highway to Middop Common, thence by the bottom fence of Middop Common to Cragg Copy, thence by Cragg Copy fence to Burnley-road, and thence by Burnley-road to Cragg Farm House aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twelfth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the tenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

THE KATTEGAT—ANHOLT ISLAND.

Provisional Light on Ostebakken.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 273 (1), of 8th August, 1889, on the intended exhibition of a fixed white and red light from a lighthouse erected on Ostebakken, western side of Anholt Island:—

The Danish Government has given further notice, that on 24th August, 1889, a provisional light was exhibited, which is visible through the same arcs, and has the same colours as the intended permanent light, but is of less power.

The provisional light is a fixed white and red light, showing white from the bearing of S. $53^{\circ} E.$ (southward of which it is obscured by Nordstrands Klint) to S. $45^{\circ} E.$; red from S. $45^{\circ} E.$ to S. $30^{\circ} E.$ over N.W. reef); white from S. $30^{\circ} E.$ to S. $25^{\circ} W.$ It is obscured by a hill from S. $25^{\circ} W.$ to S. $45^{\circ} W.$, and shows white from S. $45^{\circ} W.$ to S. $68^{\circ} W.$ It is elevated 84 feet above the sea.

The lighthouse is constructed of wood.
