THE Secretary of State for the Home Department has received through the Foreign Office the following statement, setting forth the conditions of the International Competition for prizes for the best Essays on the influence of John Howard on Prison Reform.

CONCOURS INTERNATIONAL ouvert par le Gouvernement Impérial Russe sur "le rôle de John Howard dans l'Histoire de la Réforme pénitentiaire."

1. La convocation du IVe congrès international pénitentiaire à St-Petersbourg devant coïncider avec le centenaire de la mort de John Howard, décédé en 1790 à Kherson, le gouvernement impérial russe désire rendre hommage à la mémoire du célèbre philanthrope en ouvrant un concours international sur "*Le rôle de John Howard dans l'histoire de la réforme pénitentiaire.*"

2. Les ouvrages présentés au concours, imprimés ou manuscrits, doivent être rédigés en langues russe ou française. On admet aussi des études en d'autres langues, mais il faut qu'elles soient accompagnées d'une version française.

3. Programme des ouvrages: *a.* Biographie de John Howard et revue de ses œuvres; *b.* Caractéristique des institutions pénitentiaires à l'époque de John Howard et énumération détaillée de toutes les innovations accomplies et projetées par Howard dans ces institutions; *c.* Influence des idées de Howard sur l'histoire ultérieure de la réforme pénitentiaire; *d.* Bibliographie des écrits de Howard.

4. Les ouvrages doivent être adressés pour le 1er (13) mai 1890 au plus tard au président de la commission d'organisation du IVe congrès international pénitentiaire à St-Petersbourg (place du Théâtre-Alexandra, administration générale des prisons).

5. Les ouvrages doivent porter des devises. Les auteurs feront en outre parvenir au comité leurs noms et leurs adresses sous pli spécial.

6. Le jury d'examen des ouvrages sera élu par le IVe congrès pénitentiaire international.

7. Pour les ouvrages que le jury aura reconnus satisfaisants, il sera décerné deux médailles d'or, une grande et une petite, des médailles d'argent et des mentions honorables.

8. L'auteur qui obtiendra la grande médaille d'or recevra en outre un prix de 2,000 francs en argent. L'ouvrage couronné du premier prix sera inséré dans les actes du IVe congrès pénitentiaire international. Les droits de réimpression seront réservés à l'auteur.
