Concours International ouvert par le Gouvernement Impérial Russe sur "le rôle de John Howard dans l'Histoire de la Réforme pénitentiaire."

1. 5. Les ouvrages doivent porter des devises. Les auteurs feront en outre parvenir au comité leurs noms et leurs adresses sous pli spécial.

 Le jury d'examen des ouvrages sera élu par le IVe congrès pénitentiaire international.

7. Pour les ouvrages que le jury aura reconnus satisfaisants, il sera décerné deux médailles d'or, une grande et une petite, des médailles d'argent et des mentions honorables.
