THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Vienna transmitting an Order of the Marine Board at Trieste, dated the 9th inst., by which vessels arriving from Egyptian ports on the Red Sea or Mediterranean are required to prove, in the case of Bosnian and Herzegovinian pilgrims, that they and their effects have undergone a satisfactory quarantine and disinfection. POSTAL PACKETS BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE COMORO ISLANDS.

#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. All Treasury Warrants at any time heretofore made relating to the conveyance by post of
postal packets (which term in this Warrant means
and includes all letters, post cards, reply post
cards, newspapers, packets of commercial papers,
packets of printed papers, and pattern or sample
packets) between the United Kingdom and the
Comoro Islands, and also between any British
Colony or Foreign Country and the Comoro
Islands, are hereby annulled to the extent to
which such Warrants respectively relate to the
several matters comprised in this Warrant as
aforesaid.

2. The rates of postage and additional sum for registration now chargeable and payable by the authority of the Treasury Warrants of the 29th day of May, 1879, the 14th day of January, 1880, the 15th day of June, 1880, and the 9th day of March, 1886, or any one of them, on postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to the French Colony of Mayotte to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of the said Warrants, or any one of them, and all regulations and conditions now in force as to the posting, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post between the French Colony of Mayotte and any other country or place as aforesaid, shall extend and apply to all postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to the Comoro Islands to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of the said Warrants, in the same way as if the Comoro Islands had been named or referred to in the said Warrants, and the schedules thereunder written, in the same manner as the French Colony of Mayotte is named or referred to therein.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 96 of The Animals Order of 1886, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Essex, to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcase of a cow, the property of the Reverend H. R. Bailey, of Great Warley Rectory, near Brentwood, that was recently buried, subject to the following conditions:

1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause the carcase to be examined with a view to ascertain whether the animal was affected with a contagious or infectious disease, and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcase to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause it to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.

2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, examination, and re-burial of the carcase shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.

3. This Licence is revocable by the Board

of Agriculture.

"The Guardians shall pay to any Vaccination "Officer such salary or remuneration, and " such only, as the Local Government Board " may direct or approve, whether for ordinary "duties or for occasional services; and such "salary or remuneration may be increased " or reduced as that Board may from time " to time direct or approve."

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards

the said Newton Abbot Union:
