THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following notice, dated the 14th September, from Her Majesty's Representative at Copenhagen:—

Notice concerning the enforcement, until further orders, of the provisions of Section I 2 of the Law for the Prevention of the Introduction into the Kingdom of Contagious Diseases with respect to ships arriving from ports in Peru, Japan, and the Persian Gulf, &c, and also concerning the withdrawal of the decrees of the Ministry of Justice of November 2 last and of May 8 last, in so far as the provisions contained in Section I 2 of the above law are enforced against vessels arriving from Sicily or Brazil, and also the withdrawal of the prohibition of importation included in the said decrees from the ports named, and the injunction as to the purification of travelling effects therefrom.

Inasmuch as information has been received that an epidemic of yellow fever has occurred in Peru, and cholera has broken out in Japan and Mesopotamia, effect will in consequence thereof be given, until further notice, to the provisions of Section I 2 of the Law for the Prevention of the Introduction of Contagious Disorders into the Kingdom, of July 2, 1880, with respect to vessels arriving directly from or having had communication with ports in Peru, Japan, and the Persian Gulf, that is to say, the introduction into this Kingdom is forbidden from the ports in question of used linen, used wearing apparel, and used bed linen, in so far as the objects named do not belong to travellers' personal effects.

On the other hand, the withdrawal is decreed of the general inspection commanded by the Ordinances of the Ministry of Justice, dated respectively November 2 and May 8 last, concerning vessels arriving from ports in Sicily or in Brazil, in pursuance of the Law of July 2, 1880, Section I 2, as also the Prohibition con-

tained in the said Ordinances against the importation from the places named of the objects mentioned in Section 32 of the Law, together with the purification enjoined, under official supervision, of linen, wearing apparel, and bed linen appertaining to the personal effects of travellers from thence, the which are similarly withdrawn.

There are no quarantines in force at present.

The provisions of Section I 2, of the Law for the Prevention of the Introduction of Contagious Disorders into this Kingdom, of July 2, 1880, will be henceforth in force as regards the following places:—

Marseilles; all ports in Egypt; ports in Tonquin and Cochin China, and in the East Indies, including the Dutch East India Colonies; ports in the Red Sea; the Persian Gulf; Peru; Cuba; Haiti, Porto Rico; and Japan.

Effect is given to the prohibition against the importation into this Kingdom of worn linen, used wearing apparel, and worn bed linen (not forming part of travellers' personal effects), rags, used wadding, carding wool, and paper waste, with respect to all the places named.

In addition the purification is enjoined under official supervision of linen, wearing apparel, and bed linen, brought as personal travelling effects from any of the above-named places.

These decrees come into force immediately.

## TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. The regulations made by any Treasury Warrants now in force as to the weight, length, breadth, and depth of a pattern or sample packet posted in the United Kingdom and addressed to any place within the Kingdom of Italy, shall be and the same are hereby annulled.

In lieu thereof the limits of weight, length, breadth, and depth for all such packets shall in future be respectively as follows, that is to say:— The limit of weight shall be twelve ounces, the limit of length twelve inches, the limit of breadth eight inches, and the limit of depth four inches.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—within the Districts of the Local Authorities of the burgh of Aberdeen and county of Aberdeen, comprised within a line commencing at the junction of the Fullerton-road, with the Inverurie-road at the Old Boathouse, thence proceeding in a westerly direction by the north side of Cotton Lodge-road to the Tanfield-road, thence north-westwards along the west side of Tanfield-road to the Hilton-road, thence westwards along the south side of Hilton-road to the Back Hilton-road, thence northwards along the west side of Back Hilton-road to the Inverurie-road, thence eastwards along the north side of Inverurie-road to the eastern boundary of the property of Woodside House, thence northwards along the said boundary to the river Don, thence across the Don

in a straight line drawn in continuation of the last mentioned boundary northwards to the north-west extremity of the farm steading of Danestone, thence eastwards along the farm-road of Danestone for a distance of one hundred and fifty yards or thereby, thence northward, eastward, and southward along the boundary of a grass field in the occupation of Alexander McBain, dairyman, Woodside, lying on the north side of the said farm-road of Danestone, thence eastward along the said farm-road to the public-road running between the farms of Danestone and Upper Buckie, thence southwards and eastwards along the east side of the last mentioned public-road to Persley-road at Grandholm Works, thence eastwards along the north side of Persley-road to the east end of the workmen's dwelling-houses at Grandholm Works, thence southwards along a footpath leading from the said houses to the river Don, thence southwards across the Don in a straight line to Gordon's Mill-road, thence along the north side of Gordon's Mill-road to a footpath leading therefrom to the said Fullerton-road, thence southwards and westwards along the north side of Fullerton-road to the Old Boathouse, being the point of commencement,—which was declared by Order of the Privy Council dated the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—including the High Ground Farm, situate in the township of Hellifield, in the West Riding of the county of York, in the occupation of John Coates, and other lands in the said township all comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing where the northerly point of the western fence of Waspher Hill Meadow adjoins the Midland Railway, thence along such Railway to the corner of Denbys Pasture adjoining the Railway and so along the fence of Denbys Pasture to a point where the same adjoins Causeway Syke, thence along the fence and Causeway Syke in an easterly direction to a point where the same adjoins Pitts Pasture, thence by the southern fence of Pitts Pasture to Coniston Moor and so along the western fence of Coniston Moor by Switchers Bottom to the Keighley and Kendal turnpike-road, thence along such road to the point where the Hellifield township boundary crosses such road, thence by such

boundary past Hall Field Farms to the fence dividing Grey Stones and Mallardale Pastures, thence along such fence to the bridle-road leading to Swinden Hall up to Swinden Hall, thence along the northerly fence of Mill-lane to its junction with the Marsden, Gisburn, and Longpreston-road, thence across such road and along the opposite fence to the river Ribble, thence up the said river to where Pan Beck enters it, thence up Pan Beck and Gallaber Syke to the junction with the Marsden, Gisburn, and Longpreston-road, thence down the southern side of such road in a southerly direction along such road to Boggart-lane, thence along the southern fence of such lane past the southerly side of Hellifield Green through Hellifield Village to the point where Howe-lane meets the Keighley and Kendal turnpike-road, thence up the said lane to the junction with the Midland Railway and along the Railway to the point first mentioned,—which was declared by Order of the Privy Council to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

1. The following Place (namely),—a certain field at Willesden Green, in the county of Middlesex, in the occupation of Mr. J. Mott, in which field Mr. Sidney Villar, Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority for the said county, declared on the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, that he had found pleuro-pneumonia to exist, and the whole of the premises in the occupation of the said Mr. J.
