LaThe day signals are made by means of two canvas shapes, a cone and a drum.

The night signals are red lights.

Signal No. 1, or warning signal, a black drum. This signal signifies that a storm is in existence in the Arabian Sea, which may either approach the port, or which may shortly cross one or other of the usual tracks of vessels leaving the port.

There is no night signal corresponding to this

day signal.

Signal No. 2, a black cone apex down by day, and three red lights (triangularly placed) npex

down at night.

This signal signifies that a cyclonic storm is likely to affect the port, with strong winds at first from the southward. The shift of wind will depend on the track of the storm (i.e., whether eastward or westward, &c.).

Signal No. 3, a black cone apex by day, and three red lights (triangularly placed) apex up at

night.

This signal signifies that a cyclonic storm is likely to affect the port, with strong winds at first from the northward. The shift of wind will depend upon the track of the storm (i.e., whether eastward or westward).

Signal No. 4, a black drum over a black cone (apex down) by day, and four red lights placed in

the form of a square at night.

This signal signifies that a heavy cyclone is approaching the port, and that the centre will pass over or very near the port; and hence that the shift of wind is likely to be sudden, and the force of the wind very great.
