*Board of Trade (Harbour Department), London, October 29, 1889.*

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch, dated October 10, from Her Majesty's Representative at Washington, forwarding copy of a Resolution, dated September 27, by the Board of Health for the State of Louisiana, to the effect that all restrictions against passengers from ports in Central America be removed after October 15, and that all vessels departing from those ports on and after that date be permitted to carry passengers to New Orleans, and that there should be no detention at quarantine provided they have no sickness on board. It was also resolved that after October 10 the period of detention of vessels arriving at quarantine ports should be reduced to three days.
