WHEREAS it is enacted by "The County Courts Act, 1888," that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, from time to time to alter the number and boundaries of the Districts and the place of holding any Court, and to order the discontinuance of the holding of any Court and the consolidation of any two or more Districts, and the division of any District, and to order by what name and in what towns and places a Court shall be held in such District.

And whereas it is expedient that the County Court of Sussex now held at Cuckfield should be held at Haywards Heath instead of at Cuckfield:

Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the thirty-first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety, the County Court of Sussex now held at Cuckfield shall be held at Haywards Heath instead of at Cuckfield by the name of the County Court of Sussex held at Haywards Heath.

WHEREAS Charles Neve Crosswell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, duly appointed as Commissioner for the purposes of "The Swansea Corporation Act, 1889," has transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State his scheme in the following terms:—

"SWANSEA CORPORATION ACT, 1889.

"BOROUGH OF SWANSEA.

"WHEREAS by 'The Swansea Corporation Act 1889' it was provided that the extended Borough of Swansea should be divided into such number of Wards with such boundaries and names as should be determined by a Commissioner to be for that purpose appointed by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, within three weeks from the passing of the said Act.

"And it was further provided by the said Act that the Commissioner should by his scheme apportion all the existing Councillors among the new Wards described therein and state what Alderman or other person should act as Returning Officer of each of the said Wards.

"And the said Commissioner was empowered by the said Act to make all such provisions as might be necessary or proper in consequence of the extension of the Borough and of the alteration of the Wards and of the numbers of Councillors, and Aldermen.

"And whereas by section 3 of the said Act it was provided that for the purpose of the division of the extended Borough into Wards, and of all proceedings preliminary to the Municipal Elections of 1889, the said Act should come into operation on its passing, that is upon the twenty-sixth day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

"And whereas, on the twenty-sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, did duly warrant and appoint Charles Neve Crosswell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be such Commissioner for the purposes of the said Act, and furthermore did in exercise of the powers given to him by section 21 of the said Act fix the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and
