

And whereas the said church has since been consecrated, and is called "The Church of Saint Mark, Noel Park."

And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, deem it expedient that a particular district, to comprise a part of the said new parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, shall be assigned to the said church of Saint Mark, Noel Park, and also that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church.

Now know ye, that we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the powers or authorities for this purpose contained in the several Acts of Parliament called "The Church Building Acts" as aforesaid, or in some of them, and particularly in the Act of the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter thirty-eight, in the said Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and in the said Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling them in this behalf, do hereby, with the consent of the said Frederick, Bishop of the said diocese of London (testified by his being a party to and executing these presents), assign to the said new church of Saint Mark, Noel Park, as a particular district, all that part of the said new parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended, and do direct that the same shall be called "The Particular District of Saint Mark, Noel Park."

And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the like consent of the said Frederick, Bishop of the said diocese of London (testified as aforesaid), in further exercise and execution of the powers or authorities contained in the said Acts of Parliament called "The Church Building Acts," or in some of them, and particularly in the said Act of the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter thirty-eight, in the Act of the third and fourth years of Her present Majesty, chapter sixty, in the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-six, in the said Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and in the said Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling them in this behalf, do hereby determine and declare that banns of matrimony shall be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be solemnized or performed at the church of the said particular district of Saint Mark, Noel Park, and do hereby order and direct that all the fees, dues, offerings, or other emoluments to be received in respect of such publication of banns of matrimony, and of such solemnization or performance of marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials at the same church shall, from and after the next avoidance of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the said particular district of Saint Mark, Noel Park: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

In witness whereof we, the said Eccle-

siastical Commissioners for England, have hereunto affixed our common seal, and the said Frederick, Bishop of the said diocese of London, has hereunto set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, this fourteenth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

*The Schedule.*

The Particular District of Saint Mark, Noel Park, being:—

All that part of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Michael, Wood Green, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, which is bounded upon part of the south-west by the parish of Hornsey, upon the south-east by the consolidated chapelry of Christ Church, West Green, Tottenham (or, in other words, by an imaginary line extending along the middle of the private road known as Westbury-avenue, and along the middle of Tottenham-lane), upon the north-east by the parish of Tottenham, all in the said county and diocese, and upon all other sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the remaining part of the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Tottenham from the new parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green aforesaid, at the point where Snakes-lane joins Lordship-lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of thirty-nine chains, or thereabouts, to its junction with the road called or known as Green-lanes, and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts, to a point at or near to the junction of the same road with Brampton Park-road, and extending thence south-westward to and along the southern side of the last-named road for a distance of one and a half chains, or thereabouts, to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, from the parish of Hornsey aforesaid.

**INCOME TAX.**

WHEREAS it has become necessary to renew the list of persons to supply vacancies amongst the Commissioners appointed to act in the division of Shaftesbury, in the county of Dorset, as Commissioners for the general purposes of the Acts of Parliament for granting to Her Majesty duties on profits arising from property, professions, trades, and offices: Now we, two of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, in pursuance of the powers vested in us in that behalf, do hereby convene a meeting of the Land Tax Commissioners for the county aforesaid, being respectively qualified to act as such Commissioners, to be holden at the Townhall, Shaftesbury, on Saturday, the 14th day of December, 1889, at half-past eleven o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of choosing fit and proper persons to be Commissioners to supply vacancies amongst the Commissioners for the general purposes of the Income Tax for the division of Shaftesbury aforesaid.
