TRANSIT PARCELS IN OPEN MAILS. CUSTOMS REGULATIONS.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury (hereinafter referred to as the Treasury), in pursuance of the fourteenth section of the Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882, and of all other Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs and Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by their signing the same), order, direct, and declare as follows:-

1. The provisions of the Warrant of the 8th June, 1885, made by the Treasury on the representation of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs and Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, shall (so far as they are applicable) apply to all Parcels transmitted by post in open mails (à découvert) by way of the United Kingdom between any British Colony, Possession, or Dependency, or any Foreign Country, and any other British Colony, Possession, or Dependency, or Foreign Country.

2. This Warrant shall come into operation on the day after the date of its publication in the

London Gazette.
