By the Board of Agriculture.

WHEREAS by The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, it is enacted that every Local Authority shall execute and enforce that Act and every Order of Council as far as the same are to be executed or enforced by Local Authorities, and that where a Local Authority fail to execute or enforce any of the provisions of that Act or of an Order of Council, the Privy Council may by order empower a person therein named to execute and enforce those provisions or to procure the execution and enforcement thereof :

And whereas it is further enacted by subsection four of section fifty-eight of The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, that every Order of Council shall be published by and at the expense of every Local Authority to whom it is sent by the Privy Council for publication in such manner as the Privy Council direct, and, subject to and in the absence of any direction, by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district of the Local Authority :

And whereas by Article 182 of The Animals Order of 1886 it is provided that where an Order of Council is so sent by the Privy Council to a Local Authority for publication, the Order shall be published by that Local Authority either by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the District of that Local Authority, or by means of handbills containing a copy of or a full abstract from such Order of Council either distributed to persons affected by the Order or affixed to places where local notices are usually exhibited in the District of that Local Authority, or in such other manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same :

And whereas by The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, all the powers and duties of the Privy Council under the aforesaid Acts were at the date of the establishment of the Board of Agriculture transferred to the said Board, and it is provided by the said Act that for the purposes of any Act of Parliament or Order passed or made before the establishment of the Board of Agriculture the name of the Board shall be substituted for the Privy Council and that all Orders of the Privy Council in force at the aforesaid date in relation to the powers and duties transferred by the Act to the said Board shall continue in force until revoked or altered by the same Board :

And whereas by the last recited Act further powers were conferred on the Board of Agriculture with respect to dogs :

And whereas on or about the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, the Board of Agriculture sent for publication to the London County Council, being the Local Authority for the County of London (excluding the City of London), The Rabies (Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1889, being an Order made by the Board of Agriculture under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and The Rabies Order of 1887, but the said Local Authority have failed to execute the provisions of the said Act of 1878 and the said Order of 1886,

inasmuch as they have not published The Rabies (Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1889, as required by the said Act of 1878 and the said Order of 1886:

Now, therefore, the Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Major John Trenchard Tennant, Chief Travelling Inspector of the Board of Agriculture, is hereby named and empowered to execute and enforce the provisions of sub-section four of section fifty-eight of The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of Article 182 of The Animals Order of 1886, so far as the same relate to the publication by and at the expense of the London County Council of The Rabies (Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1889.

2. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture have hereunto set their Official Seal this twenty-seventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

Civil Service Commission, December 27, 1889.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Assistant in the Nautical Almanac Office of the Admiralty.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 25, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

II. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

1. Handwriting and Orthography.
2. Arithmetic (including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
3. Algebra (including quadratic equations).
4. Logarithmic solution of plane and spherical triangles.
5. Astronomical computations, including the conversion of longitude and latitude into right ascension and declination.
6. French (translation into English) }
7. German (translation into English) }

The first five subjects are obligatory.

III. A fee will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination, according to the scale laid down, under the Order in Council of 22nd March, 1879, by notice in the London Gazette of 8th November, 1889.

IV. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for the situation of Second Class Assistant in

the Nautical Almanac Office will be held in London, under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 5th February, 1890.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the Examination.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 24th January, 1890, an "application" in the handwriting of the Candidate on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
