By the Board of Agriculture. THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

# NOTICE TO MARINERS. (No. 454 of the year 1889.) MEDITERRANEAN—EGYPT.

Port of Alexandria—Information Concerning Time Signal and Fire Signals.

THE following information has been received from the Egyptian Government, dated 28th November, 1889, concerning the time signal, and establishment of fire signals, at the port of Alexandria:—

1. A gun is fired from the guard ship "Mahomet Aly" at noon daily, when the ball is dropped the first time at the signal station on Kom El Nadoura (Fort Caffarelli).

2. The fire signals are,—One gun fired from the guard ship signifies a fire in the town; a second gun, fired two minutes after the first, signifies a fire in the harbour, near the coast or amongst the shipping.

Note.—The "Mahomet Aly" is moored in

the inner harbour, with the lighthouse on the Inner Mole Head bearing S.W. 2 W., distant

two cables.

Variation 5° 1 The bearing is magnetic. Westerly in 1889.]

And whereas the Right Honourable and Right

Reverend Frederick, Bishop of the said diocese of London, acting as such bishop, and also as the patron in right of his see of the rectory of the said parish of Hornsey, and the Reverend James Jeakes, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Incumbent of the rectory of the same parish, have, by an instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the thirteenth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eightynine, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of Hornsey, that the said new church of Saint Mary, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (also dedicated to Saint Mary) of the same parish.

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her present Majesty, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do, by this instru-ment under our common seal, with the consent (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said Frederick, Bishop of the said diocese of London, and of the said James Jeakes, hereby declare that the said new church of Saint Mary, situate within the said parish of Hornsey, and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby substituted for the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Mary as aforesaid) of the same parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said parish of Hornsey, in lieu of the said old parish church of the same parish, as fully in all respects as if the said new church of Saint Mary, so hereby substituted, had been originally the parish church of the same parish.

And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Mary as aforesaid), of the said parish of Hornsey, or of or belonging to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of Saint Mary (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said parish of Hornsey), and to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, and his successors for ever.
