WHEREAS by The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, it is enacted that every Local Authority shall execute and enforce that Act and every Order of Council as far as the same are to be executed or enforced by Local Authorities, and that where a Local Authority fail to execute or enforce any of the provisions of that Act or of an Order of Council, the Privy Council may by order empower a person therein named to execute and enforce those provisions or to procure the execution and enforcement thereof:

And whereas the said Act was amended by The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1886, and it was provided by the last-mentioned Act that the same, so far as is consistent with the tenor thereof, should be construed as one with The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

And whereas by The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, all the powers and duties of the Privy Council under the aforesaid Acts were at the date of the establishment of the Board of Agriculture transferred to the said Board, and it is provided by the said Act that for the purposes of any Act of Parliament or Order passed or made before the establishment of the Board of Agriculture the name of the Board shall be substituted for the Privy Council and that all Orders of the Privy Council in force at the aforesaid date in relation to the powers and duties transferred by the Act to the said Board shall continue in force until revoked or altered by the same Board:

And whereas by the last recited Act further powers were conferred on the Board of Agriculture with respect to dogs:

And whereas on the seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, the Board of Agriculture by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and The Rabies Order of 1887, made The Rabies (Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1889, which Order was to commence and take effect

from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine; and it was provided by the said Order that the same should apply to and be in force in, amongst other Districts of Local Authorities, the District of the Local Authority of the County of London, and should be enforced by each of the Local Authorities within their District:

And whereas the London County Council being the Local Authority for the County of London (excluding the City of London) have failed to execute and enforce within their District the provisions of The Rabies (Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1889:

Now, therefore, the Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Major John Trenchard Tennant, Chief Travelling Inspector of the Board of Agriculture, is hereby named and empowered to execute and enforce the provisions of The Rabies (Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1889, or to procure the execution and enforcement thereof, in the District of the London County Council, so far as those provisions are to be executed or enforced by that Local Authority.

2. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.

THE Board of Agriculture, acting under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, hereby authorize the Local Authority for the county of Nottingham to put in operation, within seven days after the date of this Authority, Article 6 of The Animals (Amendment) Order of 1887, dated the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, providing for the slaughter by Local Authorities of cattle suspected of pleuro-pneumonia, and the payment of compensation for the same, in respect of a certain roan heifer suspected of being affected with pleuro-pneumonia the property of Mr. Joseph Bailey, of Holly House Farm, Scaftworth.

This Authority is revocable by the Board of Agriculture.
