Additional Storm Signal.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 271 of 1887, on the exhibition of storm signals on the shores of the Atlantic Ocean, Gulf of Mexico, and Great Lakes, United States:-

The United States Government has given Notice, that on 1st December, 1889, the following signal would be adopted as one of the storm

signals of the United States :-

The signal (Information Signal) is a yellow pendant, and indicates that the local observer has received warning of a storm covering a limited area, dangerous only for vessels about to sail to The necessary information, relative certain ports. to the storm, will be given to Masters of vessels upon application to the local observer.

It is believed that the display of the Information Signal, will, in many instances, obviate the necessity for the exhibition of the Cautionary Signal (yellow flag with white centre).

Note.—The night signal for indicating westerly winds is a white light above a red light.

IONIAN SEA-SANTA MAURA ISLAND.

Fixed and Flashing Light on Cape Dukato, and Discontinuance of Provisional Light.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 28 of 1889, on the exhibition of a provisional light (fixed red) on Cape Dukato, south-western point of Santa Maura Island, Ionian Sea:-

The Hellenic Government has given notice that on 13th January, 1890, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected about 382 yards north-eastward of Cape Dukato, and

the provisional light discontinued :-

The light is a fixed white light, varied by white flashes of ten seconds duration every minute; it is visible over an arc of 288°, or between the bearings of S. 1° W., through east, and S. 73° W. A sector of fixed white light is faintly visible in Vasilico Bay, between the bearings of S. 49° W and S. 61° W.; and in clear weather the fixed white light may be faintly seen, when within a distance of 8 miles from the light, eastward of the bearing S. 1° W., or over Sesola Rock to the land. Near the limits of the arc of visibility the flashes are very faint and of short duration, gradually increasing in power as the arc of light is entered, but are only completely visible between the bearings of S. 16° E., through east and north

The light is elevated 229 feet above the sea, and in clear weather the fixed light should be seen 20 miles, and the flashing light 22 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the third order.

The lighthouse, 44 feet high, is square in shape, and constructed of masonry, with the keeper's dwelling near.
