WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Warrant dated the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and relating to Inland Postal Packets, and the Warrants amending the same.

2. On and as from the day upon which this Warrant comes into operation Clause 10 of the said Warrant of the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, shall be repealed.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, and of the said Warrant of the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six. nothing whatever shall be in any manner attached to a Post Card except a Postage and Inland Revenue Stamp or Stamps in payment of additional postage or samp duty, nor shall a Post Card be cut or folded or otherwise altered.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety. Dated this twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.
