Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

ORDER OF SECRETARY OF STATE, No. 3. (b).
EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vict., cap. 17).

WHEREAS by Part I (section 33) of the Explosives Act, 1875, General Rules are set forth to be observed with respect to the packing of Gunpowder for conveyance:

And whereas by the said section 33 it is enacted that the Secretary of State may from time to time make, and when made, repeal, alter, and add to, rules for the purpose of rescinding, alter-

ing, or adding to the general rules contained in this section, and the rules so made by the Secretary of State shall have the same effect as if they were enacted in this section:

Now, therefore, in the exercise of the powers aforesaid, I, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby order as follows:—

Notwithstanding anything in the General Rules in the said section 33 contained, it shall be lawful to enclose the outer package of any double pack-

age containing gunpowder in an external bag or covering of such material, and subject to such conditions, as may from time to time be approved by a Government Inspector, provided—

(a.) That all the requirements of the said General Rules which apply to double packages of gunpowder, shall apply to the double packages enclosed in such external bag or covering;

(b.) That there shall be contained in each such external bag or covering no article or substance other than one double package containing gunpowder as aforesaid;

(c.) That there shall be affixed on the outside of such external bag or covering in conspicuous characters by means of a brand or securely attached label or other mark, in addition to the word "Gunpowder," such distinguishing marks (if any) as may be directed by a Government Inspector.

Information has been received, dated 18th January, 1890, that the lights at the ends of the western and eastern breakwaters are exhibited:—

(1.) The light exhibited at the end of the western breakwater is an occulting white light, every five seconds, as follows:—Duration of light, three and a half seconds, followed by an eclipse of one and a half seconds. It is elevated 40 feet above high water.

And to confirm and give effect to any agreement made or to be made between the vested Companies respectively and the Company with respect to the matters aforesaid.

To alter, amend, extend, or repeal all or some of the powers and provisions of the Acts local and personal, or some of them following (that is to say)—

The East Gloucestershire Railway Act, 1864, and the Witney Railway Act, 1859, and any other Act or Acts relating to the vested Companies respectively or to their respective Undertakings.
