## PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

#### (PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—at Great Gaddesden, in the county of Hertford, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by a road at Gaddesden Row, on the east by a road leading from the said road to Water End, on the south by a road leading

from the termination thereof at Water End to the end of Black Robin's-lane, and on the west by the road called Black Robin's-lane to a junction with the road forming the eastern boundary; the said roads not being included in the Area,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the second day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

THE Board of Agriculture, acting under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, hereby authorize the Local Authority for the county of Chester to put in operation, within seven days after the date of this Authority, Article 6 of The Animals (Amendment) Order of 1887, dated the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, providing for the slaughter by Local Authorities of cattle suspected of pleuro-pneumonia and the payment of compensation for the same, in respect of a certain cow suspected of being affected with pleuro-pneumonia the property of Mr. Stott, of Lymm.

This Authority is revocable by the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. In accordance with the provisions contained in Article 99 of The Animals Order of 1886, every Local Authority in England and Wales and Scotland is hereby authorized to make, from time to time during the continuance of this Order, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of swine-fever, such Regulations as to the Local Authority seem expedient for prohibiting or regulating the exposure or sale of swine in or at any Market, Fair, Auction, Sale-yard, Sale, or Exhibition within their District (not being within the limits of a Swine-Fever Infected Area), subject however and according to the conditions, provi-

sions, and regulations applicable thereto under The Animals Order of 1886.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and shall cease to operate from and immediately after the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety; and all Regulations made under this Order shall be expressed accordingly to terminate not later than at such latter date.

3.—(1.) Every Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board of Agriculture a copy of every Regulation made by them under the authority of this Order.

(2.) If the Board of Agriculture are satisfied on inquiry with respect to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under the authority of this Order that the same is of too restrictive a character, or otherwise objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

4. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.

1. The Rabies (Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1889 (in this Order referred to as the Muzzling Order) is hereby amended as follows:

*Extension of Muzzling Order to certain Districts.*

The following Districts (namely):

County of Southampton, except the Isle of Wight.

Borough of Portsmouth.

Borough of Southampton.

Borough of Winchester.

shall be deemed to be included in the Schedule to the Muzzling Order, and all the provisions contained in the Muzzling Order shall apply to those Districts as fully as if those Districts had been included in the Schedule to that Order.

2. This Order may be cited as The Rabies (Muzzling of Dogs) Order of 1889, Amendment No. 2.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.
