REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will

observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, information to the effect that the following amendments have been made in the existing Regulations for Mauritius relating to Quarantine :—

"1. The cargo of any vessel, which shall come from an infected port, or which shall have communicated, otherwise than by signal, with any infected vessel or place, shall be fumigated externally, previous to disembarkation, by sulphurous acid gas for a period from 3 to 24 hours.

"2. When, however, there shall have been on board one or more cases of cholera, or other contagious disease, whatever may have been the number of cases on the departure of the vessel, as per bills of health, the disinfection of the cargo will be made according to Articles 5, 6, and 7, but only after the cargo shall have been disinfected externally by fumigation, by means of sulphurous acid gas during 3 hours at least in the vessel itself."

INLAND TELEGRAMS.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the Telegraph Act, 1885 (48 and 49 Vic., cap. 58), the Postmaster-General was authorized with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, to make regulations for determining the hours during which the offices appointed by him to be places for the receipt and despatch of Telegrams should be open for the transaction of telegraphic business, and for fixing the sums to be from time to time paid on account of the transmission of Telegrams, and on account of services rendered in connection therewith, and on account of the use of any Telegraphs by any persons, and for determining the conditions and purposes on which and for which such use might be permitted, and for the general conduct of telegraphic business. And whereas, in pursuance of the authority conferred by the said Telegraph Act, 1885, the Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, made certain Inland Telegrams Regulations, dated the 10th day of August, 1885, and which said Regulations were published in the London Gazette of the 22nd September, 1885. And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Regulations. Now know ye that I, the Right Honourable Henry Cecil Raikes, M.P.,

Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, given under the hands of two of the said Commissioners whose names are hereunder signed and written by virtue of the power vested in me by the Telegraph Act, 1885, and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. Regulation No. 22, of the Inland Telegrams Regulations, dated the 10th day of August, 1885, is hereby cancelled and repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof.

2. Where the sender of a Telegram has paid for the transmission of a reply thereto, and a pass has been delivered to the addressee of such Telegram, enabling him or any person to whom he may deliver the same to send a Telegram as in the said Regulations of the 10th day of August, 1885, stated, if such pass be not used, then, upon the application of the sender of the original Telegram made to the Secretary of the Post Office at any time within two calendar months after the date indicated by the Office Stamp on the pass, and upon production of the pass, the sum prepaid for a reply to such Telegram will be repaid to the sender.

3. These Regulations shall be read as one with the said Regulations of the tenth of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.
