It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

N.B. The Knights of the several Orders are to appear at the Levee in their Collars, it being (St. Patrick's Day) a Collar-day.

#### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

XTRACT from a Despatch received by the Marquis of Salisbury, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople:-

" I HAVE the honour to state that it having come to my knowledge that an Iradé had been issued for the settlement of the question of unpaid drawn Turkish bonds, I caused enquiries to be made and ascertained that an Iradé had been issued concerning the settlement of the question of Turkish bonds of the 1863, 1864, 1865, and 1873 loans drawn before the suspension of payment of 1875, and hitherto unpaid.

"I consequently made an application to the Sublime Porte for an official copy of this Irade, which has now been furnished to me, and I have

the honour to enclose a translation of it.
"From this it would appear that the holders will be paid off gradually, and will eventually receive about seventy per cent. of the value of their bonds. New bonds will no longer be issued against the old bonds of the Turkish Consolidated Debt, which are now cancelled through not being presented within the time fixed for their conversion; and from the interest which would have been paid on the new bonds had the issue been continued, a sum of about nine thousand five hundred liras, Turkish, will be available every year until the extinction of the claim, which amounts to about eighty-eight thousand Turkish

#### (Translation.)

Report of Special Council of Ministers.

THE owners of the bonds which were drawn before the stoppage of payment of the bonds of the 1863, 1864, 1865, and 1873 loans not having come forward, the sums remained deposited with the Crédit Mobilier Company, and were sub-sequently taken over, with a discount by the Treasury, to be paid on the appearance of the owners.

On account of these persons coming forward, a report was submitted on the 13th Zil Kaade 1305, asking for authority to set aside bonds to the amount of seven hundred and fifty thousand (750,000) liras (nominal value) out of the surplus of the new bonds which will remain over from the conversion, and, after deducting fifteen per cent., to issue them to these men at the market price.

In a letter received from the Ministry of

Finance, which we have studied attentively, it is stated that, as the owners of the bonds did not cease to demand settlement of their claims, and as it seemed possible to make certain reductions and modifications, counsel had been taken ad hoc with the administration of the public debt. The result of these deliberations is the following:

1. The sum originally due to the holders of these bonds amounted to one hundred and twentyfive thousand seven hundred and fifty (125,750)

. Turkish liras.

2. Instead of the 15 per cent. reduction on this sum at first decided on, a reduction of 30 per cent. is to be made.

3. A commission of one per cent. is to be

charged once for all on the payments.

4. Instead of bonds being given, as was decided in the first instance, it has been decided to assign the interest due on such bonds as were available for exchange against old bonds of the Turkish Consolidated Debt, which are now cancelled through not being presented within the time fixed for their conversion.

According to this arrangement the amount of the claim will be reduced to eighty-eight thousand and twenty-five (88,025) liras, and this will be paid off year by year with the money laid aside for the interest on the said bonds, which amounts to nine thousand four hundred and fifty-eight (9,458) liras, and in this way the new bonds will not come into circulation again.

From the above statement this arrangement appears of obvious advantage to the Imperial Treasury as compared with the former proposals; and we, therefore, unanimously advise that authority be granted to the Ministry of Finance to act upon it, and we submit inclosed the letter

in question.

· Nevertheless, in the end, the decision and Order rests with him who commands.

Copy of Vizirial Letter submitted to the Palace. The owners of the bonds, which were drawn before the payment of the bonds of the 1863, 1864, 1865, and 1873 loans was stopped, not having come forward, the sums remained at the Crédit Mobilier, and were later on paid over, with a discount to the Treasury. Some time ago a plan of arrangement was decided on to provide for the event of the owners of the sums coming forward. The administration of the public debt was consulted with a view to modifying this arrangement, and the result of the deliberation was announced in a letter from the Ministry of Finance, upon which the Special Council of Ministers drew up a report, which is submitted herewith.

This is to say, that in whatever sense the Imperial Iradé in this matter is issued it will be complied with.
