THE BANKRUPTCY ACT, 1883.

Board of Trade, March 31, 1890.

WHEREAS Sir Robert Palmer Harding vacates his office of Chief Official Receiver and Official Receiver for the district of the High Court, on the 31st day of March, 1890.

The Board of Trade, with the concurrence of the Treasury, have ordered the appointment for the district of the High Court of four Official Receivers for general purposes of the administration of bankruptcy proceedings, instituted under the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, and of one additional Official Receiver for the special purpose of the administration of bankruptcies and liquidations by arrangement under the Bankruptcy Act, 1869, and sections 159, 160, and 161 of the Bankruptcy Act, 1883.

Mr. George Wreford, Mr. Charles John Stewart, and Mr. Alfred Henry Wildy, have been appointed Official Receivers as aforesaid, as from the 31st day of March, 1890, being the date on which the said Sir Robert Palmer Harding vacates his office.

As regards the bankruptcy proceedings instituted under the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, which at the said date are pending in the High Court, and in which at the said date the said Sir Robert Palmer Harding was or is constituted Official or Interim Receiver, each of the several Official Receivers specified in the second column of the schedule hereto shall, in respect of the proceedings specified opposite to his name in the first column, be the Official Receiver of the estates of the debtors in such proceedings and discharge the duties of Official Receiver in relation to such estates, in immediate succession to the said Sir Robert Palmer Harding.

As regards all bankruptcy proceedings which from and after the vacation of his office by the said Sir Robert Palmer Harding shall be instituted in or be transferred to the High Court under the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, each of the several Official Receivers specified in the second column of the schedule hereto shall in respect of the proceedings specified opposite to his name in the first column be the Official Receiver of the estates of the debtors in such proceedings.

Mr. Edwin Leadam Hough is appointed to be an Official Receiver for the Bankruptcy District of the High Court of Justice as from the 1st day of May, 1890.

On and after the 1st day of May, 1890, the said appointment shall take effect as if the name of the said Edwin Leadam Hough appeared in the said schedule hereto in substitution for the name of the said George Wreford as to the bankruptcy proceedings in which the initial letters of the first surname of the debtor or debtors are Ke to Ri.

Mr. Peter Paget is appointed to be an Official Receiver for the Bankruptcy District of the High

Court, for the special purpose of the administration of bankruptcies and liquidations under the Bankruptcy Act, 1869, and sections 159, 160, and 161 of the Bankruptcy Act, 1883.

ORDER of the Local Government Board under the Local Government Act, 1888: Certifying Appointment of District Auditor: Assigning District and Duties (County Councils):—

South-Eastern Counties Audit District.
Counties of Kent, London, Middlesex, Surrey, the Eastern Division of Sussex, and the Western Division of Sussex.

To Hugh Lloyd-Roberts, District Auditor;—

To the County Councils of the Counties of Kent, London, Middlesex, Surrey, the Eastern Division of Sussex, and the Western Division of Sussex;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by Sub-section (3) of Section 71 of the Local Government Act, 1888, it is enacted that the Accounts of a County Council, and of the County Treasurer and Officers of such Council, shall be audited by the District Auditors appointed by the Local Government Board in like manner as the Accounts of an Urban Authority and their Officers under Sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875;

And whereas by Section 81 of the said Local Government Act, it is enacted that the Accounts of any Joint Committee appointed thereunder, and of their Officers, shall, for the purposes of the provisions of such Act, be deemed to be Accounts of the County Council and their Officers;

And whereas by Section 86 of the said Local Government Act it is enacted that for the purpose of adapting the Acts relating to Pauper Lunatic Asylums to the provisions of the said Local Government Act "the accounts of the committee of visitors and of their officers shall, for the purposes of the provisions of this Act with respect to accounts of a County Council and their officers, and the audit thereof, be deemed to be accounts of the Council and officers";

And whereas the said Hugh Lloyd-Roberts is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf, and by certain Orders We, the Local Government Board, assigned to the said District Auditor his duties, and the District in which he should act as Auditor,

such District being termed "The Metropolitan Audit District";

And whereas it is not at present the duty of any District Auditor to audit the undermentioned Accounts in any of the Administrative Counties of Kent, London, Middlesex, Surrey, the Eastern Division of Sussex, and the Western Division of Sussex, and the said Counties are respectively areas which are not included for the purpose of the audit of such Accounts in any of the Audit Districts formed by Us, and assigned to District Auditors under the said District Auditors Act; and it is expedient that provisions should be made in regard thereto as hereinafter contained:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment of the said Hugh Lloyd-Roberts as a District Auditor, and do Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—Unless We otherwise Prescribe it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the undermentioned Accounts so far as the same are subject to audit by a District Auditor and relate to a period prior to the First day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety,—

(1.) The Accounts of the County Councils of the said several Administrative Counties of Kent, London, Middlesex, Surrey, the Eastern Division of Sussex, and the Western Division of Sussex, and of their officers.

(2.) The Accounts of the Visiting Committee of any Lunatic Asylum belonging wholly, or in part, to one or more of the said County Councils, and not belonging in part to any other County Council, and the Accounts of the officers of any such Committee.

(3.) The Accounts of any Joint Committee consisting entirely of representatives of two or more of the said County Councils, or of representatives of one or more of the said County Councils and of the Town Council or Councils of any County Borough or Boroughs, and the Accounts of the officers of any such Committee.
