THE Queen has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Durham to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being void by the death of the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor Joseph Barber Lightfoot, late Bishop thereof; and Her Majesty has been pleased to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Reverend Brooke Foss Westcott, D.D., Canon of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster, Regius Professor of Divinity in the University of Cambridge, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Durham.

THE Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Rear-Admiral the Honourable Sir Edmund Robert Fremantle, K.C.B., C.M.G., Commander-in-Chief on the East Indies Station, Her Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the Royal Order of the Crown of the First Class, which His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, has been pleased to confer upon him in recognition of his services while in command of the British Fleet on the occasion of the blockade of the coast of the Sultan of Zanzibar.

THE Board of Trade have received copies of the following resolutions adopted on the 17th ultimo by the Board of Health of the State of Louisiana:—

"Whereas yellow fever exists at Belize, British Honduras, be it resolved by the Board of Health of the State of Louisiana, that, from and after April 1st proximo, all passengers from that port be quarantined and detained on their arrival at the Mississippi River Quarantine Station; and whereas infectious disease is known to prevail at present at Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, be it resolved that, from and after April 1st proximo, all vessels arriving from that port at the Mississippi River Quarantine Station shall, together with their freight and baggage, be subjected to thorough fumigation and disinfection."
