ER Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has been informed by the French Ambassador at the Court of St. James' that, with a view to prevent the importation of arms and munitions of war into the Kingdom of Dahomey, the Government of the Republic has determined to establish from the 4th of April a Blockade of the portion of the Slave Coast comprised between the limit of the French and German possessions of the Popos (6° 14' 45" of North latitude, and 0° 40' 36" of longitude West of Paris) and the eastern limit of the French possessions of Porto Novo, which, according to the arrangements between England and France of the 10th of August last, is fixed on the coast by the line of the meridian passing through Ajarra Creek.

Now, therefore, I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby order that the days shall be altered for the holding of the said Fairs which have been annually held in the parish of Holsworthy, in the said Division of the said County, and that the Fairs hitherto held in the said parish on the 1th and 1th days of April and the 20th and 21st days of September in each year shall, for the future, be held instead on the third Wednesday in the months of April and October in each year respectively.
