TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOMS.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in

order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Tuesday, the 6th proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 4, to the amount of £2,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 13th May, 1890, and will be payable at three months, or six months, or twelve months after date, at the option of the persons tendering, viz.:— on the 13th August, or 13th November next, or 13th May, 1891, respectively.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Wednesday, the 7th proximo, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Tuesday, the 13th proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

THE PLEURO-PNEUMONIA (RESERVATION FOR TREATMENT) ORDER OF 1890.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Special Provisions as regards Movement of Cattle reserved for Treatment.

Where any head of cattle affected with pleuro-pneumonia is reserved by the Board of Agriculture for observation and treatment in accordance with section 30 of the Act of 1878, then, notwithstanding anything in any Order issued under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, or any regulation of a Local Authority made thereunder, such head of cattle may be moved out of any Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place with a licence of an Inspector of the Board to the Royal Veterinary College, situate at Great College Street, Camden Town, in the administrative county of London, in a float or cattle-van properly constructed so as to prevent contact of such head of cattle with any other cattle during the movement.

(2.) The provisions of Article 15 (*Movement into or out of Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place*) of The Animals Order of 1886 shall not apply to any shed or stable at the said Royal Veterinary College which may be declared to be a Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place by reason of cattle the property of the Board of Agriculture being kept therein for observation and treatment.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Float or Cattle-Van.

2.—(1.) The float or cattle-van shall immediately after each occasion of use under this Order be cleansed and disinfected as follows:

(i.) The floor of the float or cattle-van and all other parts thereof with which the cattle, or their droppings, have come in contact, shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom: then

(ii.) The same parts of the float or cattle-van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water: then

(iii.) The same parts of the float or cattle-van shall have applied to them a coating of lime-wash.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the float or cattle-van, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed therefrom, shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with animals.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as THE PLEURO-PNEUMONIA (RESERVATION FOR TREATMENT) ORDER OF 1890.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place means a Place for the time being a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia under the Act of 1878:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

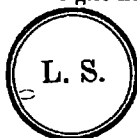

REGULATIONS respecting Competitive Examinations, held under the Orders in Council of 12th February, 1876, and 17th November, 1888, for Boy Clerkships in the Civil Service.

1. Competitive examinations of candidates for Boy Clerkships in the Civil Service will be held from time to time at such places as may be deemed expedient.

2. These examinations are open, under such general restrictions as may be laid down, to all natural-born subjects of Her Majesty, being of the prescribed age and of good health and character. The undermentioned restrictions are at present in force:

- (i.) The following classes of persons are ineligible, viz.:—
 - (a.) Persons actually serving in the Army or Navy.

(b.) Persons who have previously succeeded at an examination for the same situation or class of situations.

(ii.) The following classes of persons will not be eligible unless they produce to the Civil Service Commissioners the written permission of the authorities of their department to attend the examination dated before the commencement of the said Examination, viz.:—(a) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service, (b) Apprentices in Her Majesty's Dockyards, and Engineer Students in the Navy.

(iii.) Persons who have been trained in Normal Schools at the public expense will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Committee of Council on Education, Great Britain, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

3. A fee of 10s. will be required from every candidate admitted to the Examination.

4. Candidates must be over 15 and under 17 years of age on the first day of the competitive Examination.

5. The subjects of examination will be as follows:—

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. Arithmetic, including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions.
4. Copying MS. (to test accuracy).
5. English Composition.
6. Geography.

No candidate will be eligible who does not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners of his competency in Handwriting, Orthography, and Arithmetic.

The number of persons to be selected at each examination will be published as part of the notice of every such examination.

6. A list of the competitors will be made out, in the order of merit, up to this published number, if so many are found by the examination to be qualified for appointments in the Civil Service.

7. Each competitor named in a list will remain thereon until he attains the age of 20 years, unless in the meantime he has been appointed to a situation in some public office.

Boys on completing the 20th year of their age, or on receiving appointments, will be removed from the list.

8. From these lists the Civil Service Commissioners, on the application of Departments having vacancies, will supply, on probation, the requisite Clerks, whether for permanent or temporary duty. Selections will, as a general rule, be made by the Civil Service Commissioners according to the order of the names on the list; but the Civil Service Commissioners may select any Clerk who, in his examination, has shown special qualifications in any particular subject, if special application for such a Clerk be made by any Department.

9. No Clerk will remain more than one year in any Department unless at the end of that time the Head of the Department shall signify in writing to the Civil Service Commissioners that the Clerk is accepted by the Department. If he is not accepted, the Department will report to the said Commissioners the reasons for not accepting him; and such Commissioners will thereon supply another Clerk in his room, and will decide whether the name of the rejected Clerk shall be struck off the lists as unfit for the Service generally, or

whether he shall be allowed a trial in another Department.

10. Boy Clerks will not be retained as such in any Department after completing their 20th year; but they may, after two years (or, if admitted after 17 years of age, one year) of good service, to be certified in writing by the Head of their Department to the Civil Service Commissioners, compete under "Regulation II," among themselves, for so many Clerkships of the Second Division as shall not exceed one fourth of the number of competitors.

Separate lists will be made out of the competitors successful in the limited competitions, and selections for appointments to Clerkships will (subject to Regulation 8) be made alternately from these lists and from the lists of competitors successful in the open competitions.

NORTH SEA.

Information Concerning Certain Dangerous Sunken Wrecks.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, Nos. 11, 57, and 74 of 1890, on the existence of two dangerous sunken wrecks in the North Sea—the following particulars are now promulgated for the guidance of Mariners, until more precise information can be given:—

The two large steamers, "Gaw Quan Sia" and "Leerdam," collided in a fog on 16th December, 1889, both steamers eventually sinking within a mile of one another, after floating for about 12 hours.

From the circumstances of weather, and drift, the positions were very doubtful, and they have since been reported as follows, by different passing vessels:—

1. Lat. 52° 10' N., long. 3° 14' E.
2. Lat. 52° 24' N., long. 3° 21' E.
3. Lat. 52° 27' N., long. 3° 2' E.
4. Lat. 51° 58' N., long. 3° 2' E.

The last position is, however, undoubtedly the most accurate, having been obtained by the Salvage vessel "John Dixon" on 8th January, 1890, when she observed a latitude at noon alongside the wreck of the "Gaw Quan Sia," the longitude being by dead reckoning.

The topmasts of both vessels, and the "Leerdam's" topsail yard, were at first out of water, but by the time Her Majesty's ship "Penguin," sent especially in January to accurately fix the positions, arrived, these had been broken off, and nothing remained to show their positions. "Penguin" was, therefore, unable to carry out this service.

There is now, however, no doubt that the heads of the four lower masts, which are of iron, present

a great danger to shipping, as the depth of these below the surface at low water cannot be much more than 15 feet, and may be considerably less, both vessels having lower masts of 100 feet from keel to cap. The stumps of the topmasts probably also project above the caps.

The report of Messrs. Gann, who have been waiting for fine weather to attempt to find the "Gaw Quan Sia," and commence salvage operations, is as follows:—

"Leerdam' lies about a mile N.N.W. of 'Gaw Quan Sia.' Both vessels are quite upright. Depth alongside 'Gaw Quan Sia' 19 fathoms, and about one fathom less alongside 'Leerdam.'

"A spar, lying flat on the water, was moored as a buoy close to the 'Gaw Quan Sia' on 8th January, but has not since been seen."

The wreck of "Gaw Quan Sia" has been placed on Admiralty Charts in lat. 51° 58' N., long. 3° 2' E. The other wreck one mile to N.N.W.; and a note, "one fathom over iron masts, position approximate," written against them.

CAUTION.—As these wrecks lie, whatever their precise positions, in the track of vessels passing through the North Sea between the Strait of Dover and the north, and in other directions, the greatest care is necessary to avoid passing near the positions given.
