THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

BARTON FAIR.—CITY OF GLOUCESTER.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. By Memorial, dated the 15th day of April, 1890, a representation has been duly made to me by the Council of the city of Gloucester, as Owners, that a Fair, known as Barton Fair, has been annually held in the city of Gloucester on the 28th day of September in each year, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should in future be held on the last Saturday in the month of September in each year.

2. On the 6th day of June, 1890, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the said proposed alteration of the day for holding the said Fair.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, acting under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, hereby authorize the Local Authority for the county of Northampton to put in operation, within seven days after the date of this Authority, Article 6 of The Animals (Amendment) Order of 1887, dated the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven providing for the slaughter by Local Authorities of cattle suspected of pleuro-pneumonia and the payment of compensation for the same, in respect of a certain head of cattle suspected of being affected with pleuro-pneumonia the property of Mr. Ashby, of Church-house, Long Buckby.

This Authority is revocable by the Board of Agriculture.
