THE Queen, taking into Her Royal consideration that upon the decease of George William Hamilton, Earl of Orkney, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, which happened on or about the 21st day of October last, the title and dignity of Earl of Orkney devolved upon his nephew, Edmond Walter, now Earl of Orkney, as the eldest surviving son and heir of Henry Warrender Fitzmaurice, Esquire, commonly called the Honourable Henry Warrender Fitzmaurice, who, whilst living, was the next brother and heir presumptive of his immediate elder brother, the said George William Hamilton, Earl of Orkney, whereby, according to the ordinary rules of honour, the brother and sister of the said Edmond Walter, now Earl of Orkney, cannot enjoy that title, rank, place, and precedence which would have been due to them had their late father, the said Henry Warrender Fitzmaurice, survived his brother, the said George William Hamilton, late Earl of Orkney, and thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Orkney, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Alexander Edmond Fitzmaurice, Esquire, and Isabella Emily, the wife of John Burnham Garrett, Esquire, the brother and sister of the said Edmond Walter, now Earl of Orkney, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their late father, the said Henry Warrender Fitzmaurice, had survived his brother, the said George William Hamilton, late Earl of Orkney, and had thereby succeeded to the said title and dignity of Earl of Orkney :

And to command that the said order and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

MIDDLEWICK RIFLE RANGE.

BYE-LAWS made by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department under the provisions of "The Artillery and Rifle Ranges Act, 1885," for the purpose of regulating the above Range (with the consents of the Town Council of the Borough of Colchester and the Vestry of the Parish of East Donyland, respectively), videlicet:—

1. THE public footpaths on the War Department property crossing the said range or in rear of the butts there shall, within the limits herein-after mentioned, be closed to all persons while firing is going on at the said range.

2. Any person wishing to pass on any of the said footpaths while firing is going on will apply to the nearest sentry, and desire him to communicate with the officer in charge of the firing party, so that either then, or when three or more persons wishing to pass shall have collected, firing

may cease in order to allow such person or persons to pass.

3. No person wishing to pass shall, under these Bye-laws, be required to wait for a longer period than ten minutes.

4. No person passing over any of the said public footpaths on the War Department property shall on any account diverge therefrom.

5. The limits between which the said footpaths will be closed, as aforesaid, are marked at the points at which they crossed the boundaries of the War Department property by posts, with copies of these Bye-laws attached thereto.

6. Any person contravening any of these Bye-laws shall be deemed to commit an offence against the same, and is under the said Act liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of London as a foreign animals quarantine station (in this Order called the Quarantine Station):

All that space situate at Gallions Wharf at the Royal Albert Dock, in the county of Essex, in the occupation of the London and India Docks Joint Committee, lying between No. 3 Shed and the River Thames, and including so much of the roadway as lies between No. 3 Shed and the shed known as the Gallions Baggage Shed, and also including the said Gallions Baggage Shed.

And do hereby prescribe as follows:

1. When landed the animals shall forthwith be placed in the said Gallions Baggage Shed and shall be there kept until moved thereout in accordance with the regulations contained in Article 144 of The Animals Order of 1896.

2. When and so soon as an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture shall have certified in writing that all parts of the Quarantine Station with which the animals or their droppings have come in contact in their passage to the said Gallions Baggage Shed have been cleansed and disinfected to his satisfaction, all parts of the space above defined, other than the said Baggage Shed, shall cease to be included in the Quarantine Station, and thereupon, for the purposes of this

Order, the said Gallions Baggage Shed shall alone be deemed to be the Quarantine Station hereby defined.
