Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

May it please Your Majesty,

WE, Your Majesty's loyal and dutiful subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, now met together in General Assembly, beg with all reverence and submission to acknowledge the receipt of Your Majesty's most gracious letter.

We have to return our most grateful thanks for the continued expression which it contains of Your Majesty's attachment to the Church of Scotland, an attachment which has been shown not in word only but repeatedly in deed.

Health Circular.

As a result of the official notices received at this office, we give notice that the Egyptian International Maritime Council of Health and Quarantine has agreed to suppress the quarantine imposed on all persons entering from Persia.

In relation to Arts. 30, 33, and 36 of the Law of Health; Royal Orders of June 6, 1860, clause 12 (Gaceta of March 21, 1889); May 17, 1880, clause 12, second heading (Gaceta of the 21st); March 31, 1888, clause 13 (Gaceta of the 1st of

April); and Order of the 10th of December 1874 (Gaceta of the 13th); this general direction has agreed to publish the said notice, without prejudice to the statement of this centro, of the 14th of May, 1884 (Gaceta of the 17th), relative to the existence of the Levantine plague in various points of the Persian Gulf, persons proceeding from which have to be subjected to the sanitary regimen which depends for its details on the circumstances under which the vessels arrive.

All which I give you notice of for your information, that of the Directions of Maritime Health of this Province, in conformity with the fourth clause of the Order of the 24th of April, 1875 (Gaceta of the 29th).

THE Board of Agriculture, acting under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, hereby authorize the Local Authority for the county of Chester, to put in operation, within seven days after the date of this Authority, Article 6 of The Animals (Amendment) Order of 1887, dated the twenty-third day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven providing for the slaughter by Local Authorities of cattle suspected of pleuro-pneumonia, and the payment of compensation for the same, in respect of a certain cow suspected of being affected with pleuro-pneumonia on the Farm of Mr. Wright Swann, Hattersley, near Hyde, Cheshire.

This Authority is revocable by the Board of Agriculture.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—so much of the parishes of Stone, Draycott-in-the-Moors, and Dilhorne, in the county of Stafford, as is bounded by the road known as the Cresswell-road from the Bird-in-Hand near Hilderstone up to the river Blythe near Cresswell Railway Station, thence by the river Blythe to Stallington-lane, thence by Stallington-lane to the junction of the roads near Stallington Farm, thence by the road leading to Blacklake, thence by the road known as the Stafford-road to Spot Acre, thence by the highway leading to Cross Gate to its junction with Moss-lane and by that lane to the Bird-in-Hand aforesaid,—which was declared by Order

of the Board dated the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) TRANSFER OF PARTS OF DISTRICTS ACT, 1884.

1. Writing from Dictation.
2. Handwriting.
3. Arithmetic (first four rules, simple and compound).
4. Elementary Geography of the United Kingdom.

* * Candidates failing in any of the above-named subjects will not be eligible.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service will not be eligible unless they produce to the Civil Service Commissioners the written permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition.

5. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. A fee of 2s. 6d. will be required from every Candidate attending the Examination.
